Signage on the Path of Life

ear my hometown are the remains of an old route the locals unofficially call the Road to Nowhere. It used to be a paved road to somewhere, obviously; but as civilization would have it, new thoroughfares proved more useful and the old route was not upgraded, fell into disuse, and was eventually abandoned altogether. If the curious decide to follow the Road to Nowhere as far as it goes, sooner or later they will have to get out of the car and continue on foot. That journey, too, will be aborted in the end, as they find themselves in a jungle of growth that cannot be penetrated.

As sometimes happens in rural communities, the signage concerning this lapsed road has long since fallen away and no one thinks to replace it. After all, the road doesn't go anywhere: Why produce signs for it? As a result, from time to time unsuspecting souls just passing through depart onto the Road to Nowhere and end up, predictably, on a futile journey. It would be far preferable if you knew, from the outset, that the road you're on is a dead end. But in life as well as en route, the signage is sometimes wanting. Never more so than in a time of great uncertainty such as our own.

Signs and wonders

itizens of the Bible were much more savvv about signs than moderns are—at least, about the sort of signs that count.

While our roads are often littered with postings of every size, shape, and color, giving us more information than is asked for. some of us still have no idea where we're going ultimately. Ancient peoples looked to the heavens for signs and read the movements of the sun, moon. and stars like road maps to the future. They viewed history and current events with the same analytical eye: What is God saying to us in this volcanic eruption, this earthquake, this famine or disease or enemy attack? They also read ancient texts with the conviction that what has been written in the past continues to have significance for now and for later.

This is why Peter does not hesitate to stand in the streets of Jerusalem on Pentecost morning and interpret words attributed to David in Psalm 16 as a prophecy about Jesus. Did King David, laboring over his poems in 1000 B.C., foresee "the resurrection of the Christ" as Peter proclaims with such certainty? If he did, this revelation is overlooked in the stories about David in the books of ers err in denying that Samuel, Kings, and Chronicles. Chances are David, constantly battling his enemies and trying to keep his own house in order, didn't spend a whole lot of time imagining what the next 28 generations of his household would be up to. But if he was also a poet, one may presume he spent a little time in contemplation, ous to them that they had where ideas bubble up un-



bidden and what is unknown can become suddenly clear.

As modern people, we have to admit that astrology's heyday is over and interpreting natural events as divine rewards and punishments is probably overrated. We also find the fundamentalist work of prooftexting to be a haphazard affair at best. Anything can be proven biblically, if you have the patience to find the phrases you need—not unlike the way ransom notes can be fashioned from any copy of the local paper with scissors, glue, and fortitude. But something needs to be said for the belief that the divine will *is* spoken into creation and time and human history. Jesus is our foremost example of that. In some sense, then, there are divine clues, cues, signs, and insights capable of being read by the wise and observant seeker. Where they are and how to interpret them is less certain.

On the Road to Nowhere

ome may be at fault in reading the will of God into every detail of the weather report, while oth-God's purpose is operative at all. Perhaps the disciples en route to Emmaus fall into the second category. At first they had put their faith in Jesus as a mighty prophet of God, but he had been executed. Because the redemption of Israel was what these disciples had in mind, it was obvi-

been mistaken about Jesus. It would be foolish to expect that a dead man would save them. Even when they heard the astounding reports of Easter morning, they did not know quite what to make of the news. So they decided to head out of town.

Who knows where they thought they were going? Their intended destination was Emmaus, but the purpose is obscure. Perhaps they were going to seek wise counsel from someone there or to be with family in a dark and confusing time. Maybe they intended to go into hiding or just to get away from the current madness of downtown Jerusalem. Wherever it is they thought they were going, they were spectacularly mistaken. As disciples, the only reasonable direction for them to go is in the direction of Jesus. Him, needless to say, they had lost track of.

Jesus, however, does not lose track of his own. He

knew what road they were on and rendezvoused with them there.

Burning hearts, blessed bread

heir hearts were burning, but they did not suspect the Lord's presence. Jesus interpreted scripture with understanding, but they did not recollect the last time someone had done that for them. It was not until the final sign was given in the breaking of the bread that the travelers to Emmaus knew where they were: in the company of Christ. They also knew they were traveling in the perfectly wrong direction, away from the community of faith. Time to get back on the Jerusalem road!

How many of us, traveling in the dark along the Road to Nowhere, wake up in the hour of Eucharist and remember who we are and in whose blessed company we are privileged to stand? Even at midnight, it is not too late to turn back and regain our place among those who believe.


