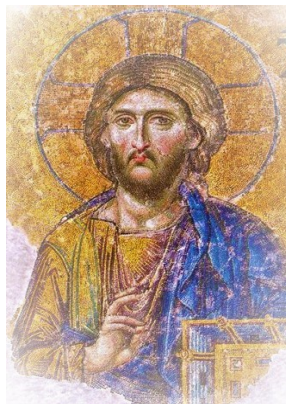

Conversations with Qoheleth

Just this morning, I was talking to Qoheleth on the phone. He's the landlord of a friend of mine who has fallen behind in her rent. Qoheleth's not a bad guy, when it comes down to it—actually has a sense of humor and is quite pleasant. But like any businessman, he just wants to be paid. He supplies the property, and my friend should come up with the rent or be evicted. It's only fair.

I agree with Qoheleth right down the line, point for point. The contract between landlord and tenant is as clear as it is ancient. But in my friend's case, the situation is a bit murkier. She's unemployed at the moment and a chronic victim in her choice of boy-friends. The last fellow treated her badly, ran up her bills, and then skipped town. My friend has been looking for work but the economy is bad. And when your education is limited, it's just that much harder to get hired.

Qoheleth doesn't want to hear excuses—he wants his money. And he tells me candidly that he's like a farmer: When the animals stop producing, he slaughters them. That's not harsh, it's just good sense. I suggest gently that it's a little more complicated when you're dealing with human beings. He gets defensive, tells me he's earned his Rolls Royce and never asked for a free ride from anyone. Why shouldn't these people do the same?

Vanity of vanities

Qoheleth's case is legally and morally airtight. But what profit comes to a man who operates from a worldview in which the properties he owns and the people who live in them have become indistinguishable? The biblical Qoheleth replies that one learns in the end what a vain pursuit the dollar is. In the end, all you can do with your largess is leave it to someone else—someone who undoubtedly hasn't earned his Rolls Royce.

Our psalmist today warns us not to harden our hearts when the voice of the Lord speaks. We recognize the voice of God when the message is compassion. Yet sadly, all too often the voice of religion has spoken in place of God, and its message was far from compassionate. We now expect to hear God in terms of judgment: God helps those who help themselves!

Trouble is, people like my unemployed friend can't help themselves without a little intervention now and then. They weren't taught the life skills that folks like Qoheleth and myself take for granted. And the situation of the socially disadvantaged is fatally interlaced with the mindset of profitability, which regards people as interchangeable and expendable—which is to say, people are no different than things. Employers who exploit workers for their talent and then let them go when the margin

of profit grows lean are no better than chronic lovers who are always moving on to the next promising affair. There will always be more tenants, more employees, more lonely souls at the end of the lunch counter. But all of this, too, is vanity and a denial of the unique worth of human beings.

Building bigger barns

The demon at the bottom of this well is the spirit of greed. We have a lot of other names for this capital sin that dress it up and make it sound more proper, like "ambition." We also have names for those who are its victims: "losers" and "bums." In a system that rewards greed and punishes the faltering, some end up building bigger barns while others are standing under the eaves hoping to get out of the rain. What's worse is that this system assumes the mantle of moral righteousness. Good people pay their bills, and bad people are known by their delinquencies.

Blessing theology is prevalent today. Wealth and prosperity are bestowed by God on the just as rewards for faithful service. So if you want to know the good guys from the bad guys, just ask to see their bank statements.

Someone once asked me if it were true that Catholics can't succeed because they're not allowed to be rich. The answer is, yes, of course Catholics can suc-

Dear Parishioners,

Welcome to August! The opening day of OLG School is **Aug 21**... *only two and half weeks away*. Where has the summer gone!?

I write to update you on a few items of interest. First, I am pleased to announce that OLG parishioner **Lissa Hutcheson** has accepted my invitation to join our parish staff as the full-time Director of Faith Formation starting Tues, **Sept 3**. Lissa has earned a M.A. in Theology and is a Master Catechist for the Diocese of Diego. On that same date, **Georgene Krusel**, who has served very ably as our Coordinator of Faith Formation for the past two years, will become a part-time Program Coordinator in this same Faith Formation office. In addition, she will also serve part-time in the parish office as Director of Publicity and Communications (parish bulletin, website management, social media, etc.).

Second, please note that *the parish office and a large portion of our campus will be closed on Mon, Aug 5 and Tues, Aug 6* due to a planned electrical service shutdown. Our electrical contractor will be replacing a significant piece of equipment called a “switch-gear” (our current one has reached the end of its useful life). **The 8:00 am Mass on both these days will be celebrated in the Parish Center, and the evening confessions of Mon, Aug 5, will be cancelled.** Thank you for your patience as we make this repair in these summer months.

Third, the members of our Finance Council and I have begun the process of digging into the results of **Fesibil-**

ity and Planning Study commissioned by the parish to help us design and implement a parish-wide capital campaign. I am grateful to all who took the time to provide input in person, online, or in writing. Your comments and feedback were most helpful! Our consultant, Guidance in Giving, Inc., is preparing an executive summary of the report. I hope to publish that summary in an upcoming bulletin later this month.

Finally, mark your calendars for our parish-wide **“Open House”** scheduled for the last full weekend of the month, **Aug 24 and 25!** Sponsored by our Parish Events Committee, this annual event takes place after all weekend Masses and allows all of us to see what our parish has to offer, to meet a few new people, and to become a part of a ministry or organization in service to our faith community and beyond. I look forward to seeing you there!

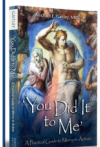

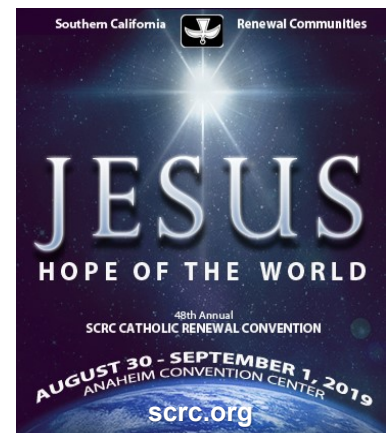

ceed—they just can't succeed for themselves. The church teaches us to assume a preferential option for the poor. This means we cannot "eat, drink, and be merry" without regard for Lazarus at the entrance to our gated communities.

The main difference between young Qoheleth and old Qoheleth is that the young man enjoyed all the advantages the world can offer and thought it was grand. Old man Qoheleth, closer to the night his life will be demanded of him, realizes that he was grandly mistaken. How close are we to making the same mistake?

Christ is all and in all

Saint Paul's advice remains contemporary: We should seek what is above and use the resources of this world for a heavenly advantage. Material comforts are objectively good—that's why we all want them. But the wise will barter them to gain an

advantage that cannot be taken from us or willed to our survivors. Christ is all, Paul says simply. Christ is the soul and center, the Alpha and Omega. There is nothing but Christ, and it stands to reason there is no one but Christ whom we encounter in our daily dealings with one another. We cannot use people as means to ends, and we dare not view the fate of a child of God as irrelevant to our own. If Christ is all, then there are no expendable people. Everybody counts. Everybody matters: Qoheleth, my unemployed friend, you, me. It was as much for the fate of Qoheleth as anyone that I pleaded my friend's case to him. It gave him another chance to choose the way of compassion. And it was for my sake, too, that I interrupted the building of my own barn today. We're all in Christ together.
