Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

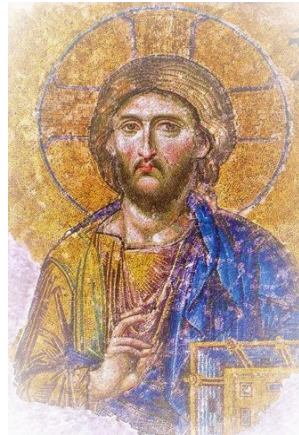

Neither the Present Nor the Future

If I could rescue only a handful of verses from the last Bible to be flung on some apocalyptic bonfire, I admit these lines from Romans 8 would be contenders. They have been among my favorites for years. How many times have I found myself in a difficult hour, wondering how I might pull myself out of this one, only to find these words floating into consciousness: Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Trial or distress or persecution or hunger or nakedness or danger or the sword? So the passage goes in the old breviary translation. Those lines have saved me from many trials that might have robbed me of courage and from many dangers that seemed poised to consume me. If you can only make one point with your people this weekend, consider this one: Nothing can keep us from the love of Christ. They don't need a homily if you can just get them to commit Romans 8:35 to memory and believe it.

I don't want to suggest that there is ever a time when the epistle upstages the gospel—although years ago Father Raymond Collins wrote a book, *Preaching the Epistles*, that encourages us to consider proclaiming the gospel as contained within the letters. In the first century, a compelling word from Paul was just the thing to break open the gospel of Jesus Christ to people who had never heard it. And I trust you'll understand that there are plenty of folks regularly in

the pews who have not been evangelized—yet. Paul is a great one to take on that mission, with a little collaboration from the homilist.

Nothing can keep us apart

“**A**nguish and distress” can't take Christ away from us. Count the ways we suffer from grief, self-doubt, loneliness, depression, and personal failures. As difficult as these burdens are, they cannot dissolve our bond with the one—the only one—who saves.

“Persecution” can't do it: nothing that comes from the outside, no kind of social pressure, rejection, disapproval, libel, or shame. We have nothing to fear either from “famine or nakedness.” These and other material deprivations can cause great harm and even threaten our existence. But not our life, ultimately, because our life is in Christ. Should we feel anxious in the face of “peril”? We live in a world full of reasons to be insecure: pandemics, racism, domestic violence, poverty, and economic instability. A sudden illness could wipe out our savings. Paul assures us that even if the worst things we can imagine come to pass, they cannot put us beyond the love of the one who gave his life for us.

How about “the sword”? Violence is the great dark love song of a generation that the Saint John Paul II called a culture of death. But Jesus himself was a

victim of capital punishment, and even the cross could not break our communion with him. In fact, the cross became the very bridge through which our reconciliation with God was achieved and over which humanity can now safely pass for the grand reunion.

Words with authority

Paul does not speak as one who is theorizing. He does not say, “In my opinion” or “It seems to me.” He uses broad, absolute language: “For I am convinced that nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.” Nothing. Not death nor life—our present state of affairs is not an impediment, as the church's position on purgatory and praying for the dead has always suggested. Not angels and principalities, those ancient powers of the air that could be capriciously well-intentioned or malicious, just as the spirit of good or evil may inhabit a person today. Interestingly, Paul targets time as being no obstacle, whether it be the present or the future, now or later. One might hope to extend that to the past as well, because many people believe that God will never forgive what lies there.

Powers—worldly authorities like governments, churches, parents, human law, and public opinion—cannot keep us from the heart of God. And we need not be anxious about height and depth, shorthand for the heavens and the underworld, because these, like

everything else that exists, are mere creatures in the hands of the Creator, who is unreservedly on our side.

Is this the gospel? Paul proclaims it as such. Remember, he wrote before the great canonical gospels were written, when the mystery of faith was held in the heart and not between the pages of a book. Paul speaks consistently with Isaiah, who insists that all who thirst can come to the water; and with Jesus, who invites multitudes to take and eat. There is something for everybody here. No matter who comes, or what they need, there will be enough.

Sufficiency is the message

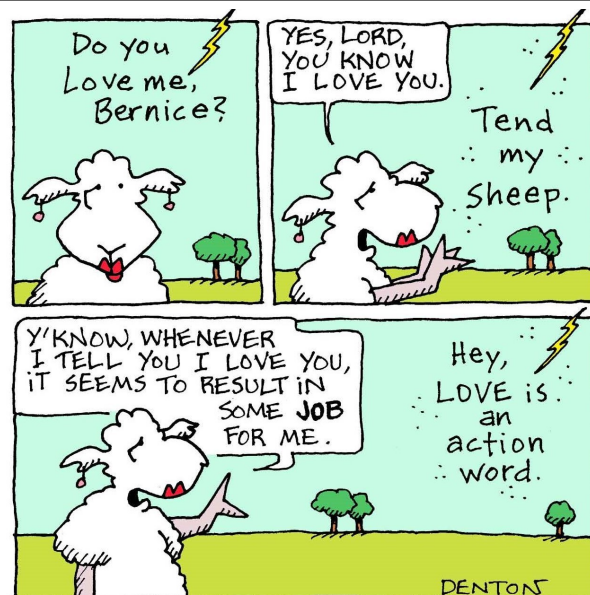
"All ate and were satisfied," Matthew tells us concerning the day of loaves and fishes. That satisfaction is something

the world cannot give, regardless of what they say on television. Because sooner or later, the various perils and powers that Paul delineates will be brought to bear on our circumstances, and we may fear the loss of everything, including God's awareness, compassion, and care. Paul's adamant words fortify us against that day. In Christ, we do have everything we need, come what may.

When confronted with the question—to preach the epistle or the gospel?—we might find our answer in remembering that, before there was a New Testament, Paul's proclamation was the gospel to the Gentile world. His writings remain the most impassioned testimony the church has ever heard, and we still need to hear them. Peter may have gotten the Chair, but sometimes Paul deserves to get the last word.

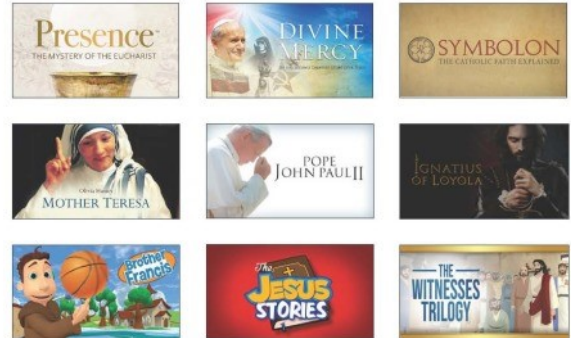

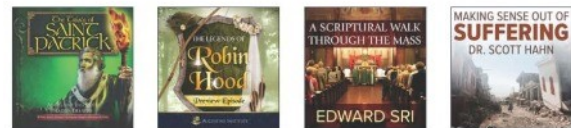

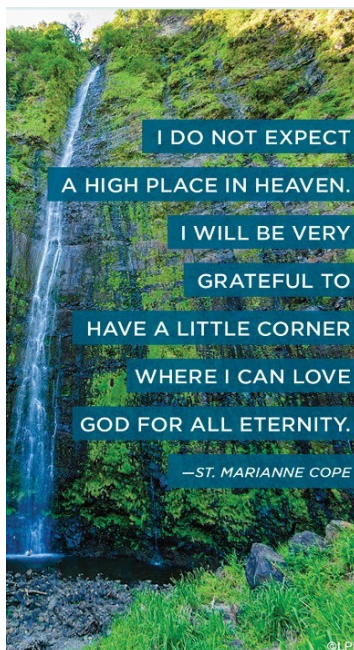

Feast Day – Aug 4

Born near Lyon, France, this farmer's son studied for the priesthood for many years, and eventually was ordained more for his devoutness and good will than for other qualities. But he became a model parish priest in Ars-en-Dombes, where he served for 40 years. He was devoted to his parishioners, and became famous for rigorous preaching and insights in the confessional. The Cure of Ars, as he was known, spent up to 18 hours a day hearing the

confessions of pilgrims who sought him out. He is the patron of parish priests.
