Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

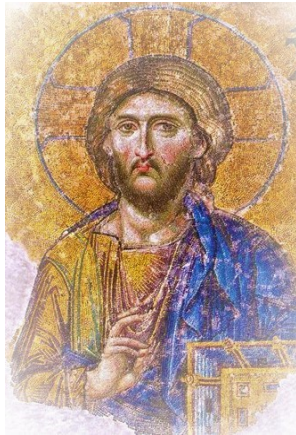

God Passing By

“**O**ur God is a walking God,” in the words of a spiritual. Where does such an idea come from? On one level, it obviously means just what it says: God is on the move. We don’t believe in a static Deity who rested on the seventh day and hasn’t budged since. God is in motion, and the people of God are therefore pilgrims and sojourners on the road to a better day.

But the image of a “walking God” is also biblical. God strolled in the garden in the cool of the evening, we are told, as the first man and woman hid guiltily among the trees. And when Moses, after years of intimate conversation with God, asked to see divinity up close, God’s “beauty” passed him by. Once more, the glory of God passed before Moses as he received the replacement tablets of the Law. Ever after, theophanies have been depicted as God crossings: encounters with the One who lives and has being—and moves.

Walking, yes—but on water?

It is not surprising to the biblically literate person that God walks. Nor should it amaze us that God might choose to take a stroll across the less-than-solid surface of the sea. Job first noted in his reply to Bildad that God alone “treads upon the crests of the sea.” Later, when God addresses Job in the great final audience, God borrows the image to confront his faithful servant: “Have you entered

into the sources of the sea, or walked about in the depths of the abyss?”

The image is far from random, as scripture elsewhere makes clear. Walking on water is not an activity that merely points out how special God is. Any miracle might make that case. But the abyss was a singular place of terror for ancient peoples, home to sea monsters like Leviathan, the great dark force that symbolized original chaos. The God of Genesis won a great victory over chaos in the ordering of creation. The Creator forced limits upon the sea by setting the firmament and causing the emergence of dry land. In the tension between ungoverned chaos and divine order, there is no contest. God and order take charge primordially.

If chaos represents the disobedient heart bent on wild and unreasonable ways, then dominion over the sea means that God’s will is stronger than the very source of evil. God’s victory lap on the waves is a way of demonstrating who is sovereign. Christians should instantly recognize the signature of theophany in Jesus’ otherwise inscrutable walk across the Galilee.

Over troubled waters

No one ever mistook the original disciples for Christians, needless to say. Do they immediately recall the scriptures that will enable them to unpack this revelation as Jesus comes to them across the water? Unfortunately, no; their

best guess is that they are seeing a ghost. Jesus offers them the biggest hint possible when he calls out, “Take courage, it is I.” Any half-awake student of the Bible might know that “It is I” and “I am he” are iterations of the unique address that God claims for all eternity: “I AM.”

Sadly, the disciples are not even half awake. In the three gospels that tell this story (Luke doesn’t), the curious supernatural event takes place directly after the feeding of the 5,000, when one might presume the followers would be more alert to divine possibilities. Instead they depart the scene by boat, leaving Jesus to dismiss the crowds himself and then to enjoy a lone session of prayer. The disciples find themselves in troubled waters as a storm predictably arises in the absence of their Lord.

Mark tells the story with theophany in mind. When Jesus comes walking on the waves, he intends “to pass them by”—not to ignore the disciples, certainly, but to “pass by” in the way divine glory traditionally does, after humanity gets a good look. Unlike Old Testament times, however, Jesus is persuaded not to go beyond the terrified group and gets into their boat instead. Chaos is immediately dispelled. Humanity is no longer left to fend for itself when the divine shares the same boat with us.

Matthew enlarges the story to give a significant role to Peter, as is Matthew’s prac-

tice. In typical fashion, Peter first gets it right in his willingness to take a faith walk—and then gets it wrong as his faith proves to be too shallow for the task. This shift in perspective takes the emphasis off the theophany and puts it on the character of Peter, who represents the church. We have what we need so long as we stay focused on the Lord. We run into trouble when we focus on our fear.

John's version subtracts Peter from the story but alters the message by having the boat arrive instantaneously on the shore without Jesus getting into it. This addition shifts the focus away from Jesus and the disciples and toward the biblical image of Passover: the miraculous deliverance to dry land on the other side of the sea.

"It is I"

It is I, Jesus insists in all three versions of this

intriguing story. Whether you focus the story on theophany, discipleship, or Passover deliverance, the common element is the revelation of who Jesus really is. He is the one whom the wind and the seas must obey, the master over chaos. When we find ourselves on troubled waters, we can take courage: the Lord is near, even sharing the humble boat of our humanity. If we had the chutzpah of Peter, we might scramble into the water ourselves and start walking. Those among us who have are known as saints. But we know it takes only a mustard seed of faith to do what Peter did. When the Lord says, "Come," any one of us might step out of the boat and face down the elements of chaos. The One who first subdued the wild abyss will not allow us to sink now.

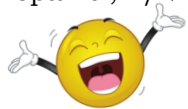

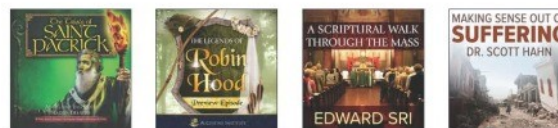

Feast Day – Aug 11

Though 10 years younger than her townsman, Francis of Assisi, Clare was drawn to his radical message of serving God in abject poverty. Despite objections from her aristocratic family, who wanted her to marry, she gave up the world with Francis' help and founded the Second Order of St. Francis, known worldwide as the Poor Clares. For 40 years, she guided the San Damiano community, whose nuns included her sister and widowed mother. She served the other nuns who went out to beg, was often

sick because of their hard life, and was proclaimed a saint just two years after she died.
