Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

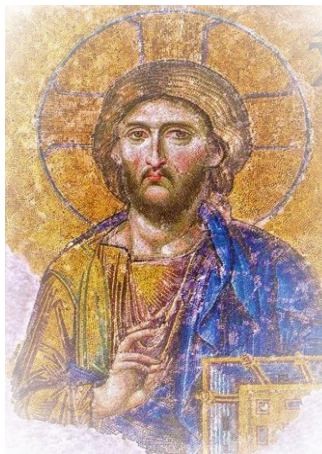

Possessing our Souls in Patience

German writer and professional pessimist Franz Kafka wrote in his diary that impatience was at the root of every sin since the Garden of Eden. This insight—from a man who could vividly imagine waking up one morning as a cockroach—demonstrates Kafka's supreme sense of anxiety at the heart of the human condition. His angst-ridden and unfinished novel *The Trial* is a masterpiece of uneasy anticipation for the other shoe to drop as a man faces judgment for a crime that is never specified by accusers who are not revealed. This, Kafka argued, is mortal life: condemned to die from birth for no good reason and sentenced to live with this knowledge hanging over our heads all the while.

Yet he names the root sin impatience and not dread, because we exist in a state of discontent with now and a desperation for later, whatever it may hold for us. All of us just want to get on with it, he insists. All of this waiting, even if we're waiting for Godot or the guillotine, is killing us. The idea of "waiting in joyful hope," naturally, is something that never occurred to Kafka. Advent waiting is fundamentally an affirmative experience. If we exist in a constant state of dread, we cannot have Advent. If we wait for nothing at all, it is not truly an Advent season. If we anticipate business as usual and nothing much to change, we do not have the

spirit of Advent within us. To be Advent people, we have to dream big dreams and expect the impossible with the confidence of faith.

Even the desert will bloom

City dwellers can be forgiven for thinking that the prophetic image of a flowering desert is a metaphor for God's miraculous ability to do the impossible. But that's not quite the picture Isaiah has in mind. As a citizen of a nation surrounded by wasteland, Isaiah knows that the desert does bloom most every spring. This wondrous happening is not due to heroic measures of irrigation or any human effort. The desert blooms because of annual rains—the more rain there is, the more spectacular the flowering.

This does not take away any of the miraculous quality of desert flowers. Why should a barren landscape come to life with colorful profusion after the rains? Tough, prickly cactus produce surprisingly delicate blossoms. Bare and leafless branches bring forth bright flowers right from the stem. Plants that are nothing more than heaps of dead matter suddenly leap into life and become mounds of blooms. The barren sand sprouts a carpet of wildflowers whose seeds have waited a year, sometimes a century, under inhospitable conditions to come to life. A blooming desert may be a predictable natural event, but that

makes it no less astounding.

If you want to see a desert bloom, it does not take a supernatural event. It only requires a patient biding of time. Human patience, we may suspect, is the real miracle to hope for.

Farmers also wait

The letter to James commends us to wait in patience, too, but this time the image is of a farmer tilling the soil. The main difference between a farm and a desert is deliberate human intervention. God makes the desert bloom; the farm depends on our efforts. But not entirely: Even on the farm, a lot depends on sun and rain and other acts of God. And maybe the most important ingredient in farming is time—the harvest can't be achieved just any old day but only when the crop is ready.

Waiting for God to act, or for our own labor to be fruitful, are similar in that both involve "possessing our souls in patience," as Jesus once advised. Waiting is a faith-inspiring event because it requires us to take our hands off the controls for the time being. We have done our part. We have made our effort. What happens next is not ours to determine. Certain personalities have a harder time with this concept than others, and a lot of fingernails are sacrificed in the interim.

"Should we look for another. . . ?"

John in prison betrayed his impatience to Jesus. He had testified boldly to his belief that Jesus was God's Lamb, indeed the expected one for whom John had prepared the nation. John had worked particularly hard in tilling the soil for the harvest he anticipated. But now he couldn't wait any longer. To be fair, from his perspective death seemed perilously near and if he were going to see the harvest, it had better come quick.

"Are you the one who is to come?" John asked Jesus. A strange question from the one who had already declared that Jesus was the one. But Jesus is not offended. In fact, he seeks to reassure John that his first impression was true. "Go and tell John what you hear and see." Jesus has confidence that John will recognize the harvest by the fruit it bears. The blind, the lame, the lepers, the deaf, the poor, and the dead are all rejoicing at the arrival of this hour. Those

who have longed for the Kingdom will now know its blessing.

But as Jesus points out, the least in the Kingdom are greater than John, because they share a certainty in this season of blessing. John hesitated. Happy are those who don't!

What do we go out to the desert to see?

Advent waiting is not about tapping a foot impatiently while four Sundays go by and candles are lit one by one. "Waiting in joyful hope" is like realized eschatology: What will be, already is. What we await is given to us now. If we hope in it, it is ours. If we expect to possess it, we already do. The reverse is also true. If we fear that our hope is a mirage, if we refuse to anticipate until we have tomorrow in hand, if we cannot believe until we see, then we are indeed wasting our time. All good things come to those who wait. Without the wait, there is no harvest.

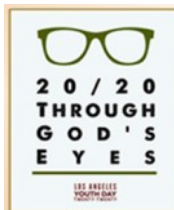

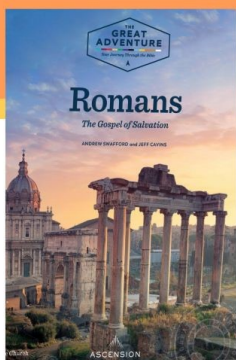
