

### Reason to Rejoice

sis the season to be jolly, as the song goes. But even if the jolly gene has managed to escape you, or this particular season finds you with plenty of specific reasons not to be happy, there is cause for rejoicing here, as the Bible tells us. In fact, we Christians are called to the vocation of joy, a fruit of the Holy Spirit not dependent on our present circumstances or our emotional frame of mind.

Maybe that's why the presider is wearing an unusually upbeat color like pink today, and why the church year includes a day called Gaudete Sunday, which means "rejoice." We are called to rejoice, even though it's not Christmas yet. We are invited to joy, even though the fulfillment of our hope is yet to be realized. Without seeing, we believe. Without holding it in our hands, we already claim what has been promised.

These ideas are foreign to our culture. Why should we be happy about something we don't have? If what we long for has not arrived, how can we celebrate it? The kind of joy to which Christians are invited is not the sort that comes when the reward has already been achieved and there is nothing left to wait for. We are the people who "wait in joyful hope," as we say at every Mass. The time of anticipation is part of the season of joy, because our faith makes us confident that God's promises are as good as accomplished.

### Every day is "almost"

t is the nature of being human that we are never quite at home in our world. There is always something missing even in the most perfect day, and something still to be wished for in the most ideal season of our lives. As children, we long to be old enough, and we spend adulthood wishing we were younger. We may be strong and healthy, but we wish for love. When we have love, we wish for more security. When we have security, we may want more time and freedom to enjoy it. When we finally have freedom, our health may begin to fail or those we love may have moved beyond us. Being human means we rarely if ever can gather up all the fragments of our longing and hold them in one place for more than a moment.

That's why we can appreciate the idea of celebrating a day that is almost here, a reality that is almost close enough to touch. We know that this world, with all of its remarkable beauty and wonder and promise, cannot give us everything we hope for. Life is too short, and too fragile, to deliver every desire to our door. Even the happiest person on the planet right now is only "almost home" to his or her deepest fulfillment. Because a really perfect day would never end, and its finality reminds us that suffering and death are always right around the corner.

To place our hopes in what

"is," then, would be a grave mistake. Yet to place our hopes in what is yet to be ah, now that is a challenge only faith is prepared to meet.

## The question in our hearts

n the time of John, the people were filled with expectation and asking in their hearts if he was the Christ. He was a great prophet and preacher, of that they had no doubt. And he gave them practical moral advice about how to live: to be generous with what they had, honest in their dealings with each other, and content with their material wealth. But was he the answer to the question in their hearts? Would he put the waiting of many generations to rest at last?

John replied that there was more to come, specifically that One mightier than he was coming who could bring more to the people than John himself could dream of. The actual, original Christmas had come and gone without much notice, and the world was still in Advent, waiting and hoping.

When Jesus finally burst upon the scene, did he bring the waiting to an end? Yes, and no. Jesus announced a coming Kingdom, and a pending hour, and a Holy Spirit that would descend when the time was right. Still more waiting, still more preparation to do. The hour arrived with its glory and suffering, the disciples became the





# IRA Required Minimum Distributions

s scripture reads, "Jesus said, Give and it will be given to you...For the measure you give will be in turn, the measure that you get back." After vears of contributing to tax -deferred IRAs and 401(k)s, income tax is due on that money when a person withdraws it in retirement. Annual withdraws from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>. But, IRA owners that are  $70\frac{1}{2}$  or older may make charitable contributions of up to \$100,000 per vear directly to an eligible charity (e.g., Catholic Parish, School, Foundation, etc.) without paying income tax on the transaction. If you file a joint return, your spouse may also make a charitable contribution of up to \$100,000, meaning couples can exclude up to \$200,000 of their retirement savings from income tax if they donate it to a charity. Oualified charitable contributions must be made by December 31 each year in order to exclude that amount from income.

Charitable contributions can only be made from IRAs, not 401(k)s or similar types of retirement accounts. Donors might need to roll funds over from a 401(k) to an IRA if they

Donors should consult with their personal tax advisors on the donations and the tax implications. Donors may make these donations directly to the parish, school or ministry of their choice or they may make it through the Diocese of San Diego at no additional cost.
