Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.



The Right Way to be Righteous

What is a righteous person supposed to look like? We can make all kinds of guesses, some scholarly, others opinionated. The prophets might declare a soul righteous who walks in the path of justice and peace. A person who exhibits a preferential option for the poor is righteous in a Catholic sort of way. The martyrs of the church were certainly righteous in their love of God more than their own lives. We can make moral judgments or insist on a particular display of bravery as the litmus test for this quality. And all of these notions, while admirable, would all be wrong from a Hebrew point of view.

The Hebrew word for righteousness implied a true weight, as the one used to balance an honest scale. A righteous weight is one that is what it says it is. Righteousness described a straight path that goes directly without meandering to its destination. A sacrificial offering was righteous if it followed the prescriptions of the law flawlessly. The measure of this characteristic is met when a thing meets its standard perfectly. That's why, according to the Hebraic use of the word, a righteous person is one who keeps the law.

Joseph, betrothed to Mary, was deemed a righteous man. In terms of salvation history, is this a good thing?

Fast-forward to Paul

Now Paul of Tarsus, he was a righteous fellow. A Pharisee well esteemed by the Sanhedrin, he was ferocious enough in service to the law that he was eager to hand over Christian "lawbreakers" to their deaths. Their leader, Jesus, was an infamous lawbreaker himself, not respecting the Sabbath imperative and interacting with the unclean: the sick, women with a flow of blood, the dead, and Samaritans. Jesus was clearly not among the righteous, and Paul saw such people as a threat to God's holy way of doing things. Such people, Paul was certain, were blasphemers even if they didn't happen to say I AM in regard to themselves.

It is extraordinary to consider that one day Paul would call himself a "slave of Christ Jesus" without blushing. The spotless Pharisee would submit himself to the authority of one who had declared himself the "lord of the Sabbath." Paul would come to believe that the freedom of the children of God was a greater thing than absolute observance of the law. It was to this outrageous freedom that Paul chose to enslave himself.

Those who are militantly law-abiding today, moralists par excellence, will have trouble hearing this message. Rules are not made to be broken, and the lines are drawn so that we might live tightly within their perimeters. The right-

eous today are not unlike those of biblical times. They want a society in which values are black and white, good and evil are clearly defined, and sinners and saints have nothing in common. I saw a bumper sticker for 2 Corinthians 6:17 recently. In front of me on the freeway was a righteous person for sure, for the citation reads: "Go out from among them and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing."

Backpedal to Ahaz

As prophets go, Isaiah was a great one. Chances are if he had an oracle for you, it could be trusted. But King Ahaz was a cautious character, motivated more by fear than obedience to the divine command. This is a red alert for righteousness: the literal fear of the Lord. When Isaiah tells Ahaz that God wants to give him a sign, Ahaz strikes a pious pose: "I will not tempt the Lord!" Truth is, he doesn't want to get anywhere near the Lord.

Real obedience involves listening, and Ahaz isn't listening. There's a difference between demanding a sign from the Almighty and being offered one free of charge. Isaiah pronounces God "weary" of religious posturing in the guise of goodness. Since Ahaz will not choose a sign, God makes the selection for him. The Emmanuel prophecy is the result.

To Joseph at last

The carpenter Joseph shows every sign of being a righteous Jew. He betrothed himself to the virgin Mary and now she's turned up undeniably pregnant. The right thing to do is to cancel the wedding and divorce her, as the custom required. Mary might also be turned over to the elders for judgment and, possibly, stoning. We hear enough about so-called honor killings in the Middle East these days to know that such an outcome is well within the range of probability.

But there's one word in this story that tips us off to the idea that Joseph is more than a strictly righteous man. The word is "quietly." Now, Joseph is not exactly heroic in this portrayal. He doesn't go out there on a cultural limb and actually talk to Mary about her situation: take a risk, question her about the circumstances and maybe even believe the scenario she might posit. He doesn't go the greater compassionate distance and consider marrying her despite the uncomfortable reality taking shape in her. But he does

take one step beyond righteousness when he resolves to divorce her without exposing her presumed sin. He will not offer her the mantle of his protection, but he will provide her with the opportunity to come forward with the father of the child and marry him instead.

It's this small step outside the pale of righteousness that God exploits with the usual extravagance. Quickly, the angel is dispatched, the dream reveals, and Joseph is offered the chance to make the leap of faith. Eternity may hang on the slenderest reed of opportunity.

Beyond righteousness

Living in the law is not necessarily a bad thing, and rules are certainly useful guidelines. But moral absolutism tempts us to sin by closing our hearts to the risk that trust, compassion, and courage represent. Joseph was a righteous man, but he was also more than that. Even a mustard seed beyond righteousness is enough to bring the kingdom of God closer into view.






