Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

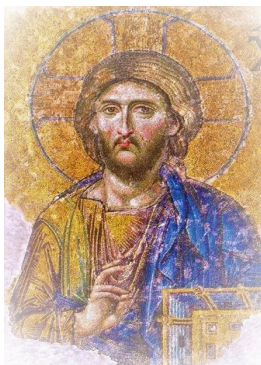

Jesus, Lost and Found

How could you possibly lose Jesus? He's the boy with the radiant halo and the singular genealogy. Follow the trail of minor miracles and cured childhood colds and there he is. Or so we might imagine. After all, Mary and Joseph had *one* child. Was it so difficult to keep track of their adolescent? And they didn't notice him missing for days? The story begins to sound more suspicious by the minute. This family was on the road in first-century Palestine, and traveling used to be a significantly more dangerous activity then than now. Highway robbery was commonplace, and journeys on foot took a considerably longer time to accomplish. You stayed together. You took greater care.

But we can also imagine that Mary and Joseph kept Jesus on a long leash. After all, he was at the age when a boy could nearly be counted as a man. And one suspects that Jesus showed a special maturity for his age, as indicated by his response later at the Temple and the rapt attention of the religious teachers. Mary and Joseph probably had a lot of confidence in Jesus and had become accustomed to his independent ways.

Still, the more we look at this story, the more we realize it is not about child-rearing technique as practiced by the Holy Family, and we are not expected to learn anything about the historical boyhood of Jesus. We are not glimpsing a charming scene about

the domestic life of the perfectly pious. So what is Luke trying to tell us?

Samuel as the model

As an evangelist, Luke pursues a focused agenda relentlessly in both his gospel and Acts. Among his themes are the centrality of the Temple, the obligations of faith, and journey as a metaphor for spiritual growth. When the Holy Family takes a trip to Jerusalem, of all places, we can be sure this is no family vacation. And it would be anemic to determine that the lesson here is about being an obedient child to God and parents, as the story is often wielded by catechists. When Mary, Joseph, and Jesus set out on the road, we understand them to be expressing outwardly an experience of growth in faith. They are embarking on a new phase of being a "holy" family, that is, dedicated to God, and the fact that Jesus is 12 at the time of this incident is no accident. "The man in the boy," as one scholar puts it, is about to be revealed.

This story has its parallel in the story of Hannah and Elkanah, the parents of the prophet Samuel. They also took a journey to a holy shrine (this was in pre-Temple days, when a shrine was as good as it gets) resulting in a prophecy, miracle birth, and consecration of their son to God. At age 12, according to Jewish tradition, Samuel began his vocation of prophesying. The moment a boy becomes a man, it

seems, he takes on the work that God intends. This would be in line with the cultural practice of that century to apprentice a son to his father's business at that age.

Up to now in the gospel, Luke has announced the identity of Jesus many times. This identity has been declared by the angel Gabriel, Mary, Zechariah, a choir of heavenly hosts, and the prophets Simeon and Anna. But now Jesus is 12, and it is time for him to speak this awareness himself. His words at the conclusion of the story are clearly the point of telling it. Before this year, Jesus was content to be the son of Mary and Joseph, but now that he is an adult, the only authority he will recognize is God.

The place and the message

Jesus would not have chosen the backstreets of Nazareth for this proclamation of his identity, naturally. For every Jewish believer, Jerusalem is the city of prophets, and for Luke's purposes, the Temple is key to the story of the gospel. Jesus is presented there as an infant, re-presents himself at maturity, returns to the Temple at the apex of his ministry to claim it with his cleansing action, and his followers return there again and again to praise God in the Book of Acts. If the Temple is the chosen dwelling place of God, then Jesus is keenly identified with that structure and becomes himself the "temple not made by hu-

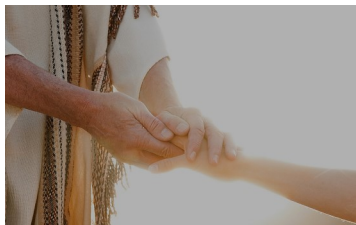

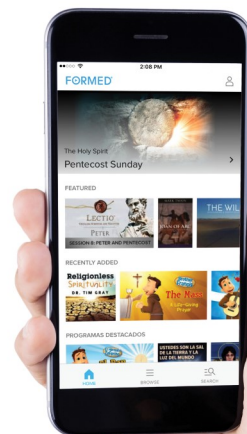

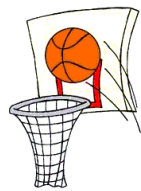

man hands” that will be “raised up in three days.”

So it makes sense for the Holy Family to take the journey to Jerusalem when Jesus is 12 and for him to choose the Temple as the place of his pronouncement. But the seeming harshness of his words is what strikes even the most casual listener to this story. How could he talk so coldly to his mother? How could he be so spare and unyielding at such an hour of crisis for his parents?

These hard words match perfectly the tone Jesus routinely takes with those who try to sentimentalize his message. Despite our modern emphasis on family values, Jesus has few soft warm words about nuclear families throughout his ministry. Serving God is a priority; clinging to home and hearth is a distraction that becomes too easily an excuse for true discipleship. Even Mary gets an earful when she

seems to question his choice.

Orientation is everything

“Must” is a big word for Luke. He uses imperatives and absolutes liberally because he views discipleship as an either-or proposition. Though Luke’s gospel is often regarded as a warm fuzzy because of its infancy narrative, generous inclusion of women and foreigners, and many healing stories, Jesus the teacher is no pushover in his presentation. You must orient yourself to the Kingdom or have no part of it, he says in various ways and situations. The occasional failure is acceptable within these high standards, but being mealy mouthed in your commitment is not. Once you’ve come of age in faith, the only allegiance left is to God.
