A Tale of Two Axes

veryone beyond grade school age in this country knows the story of George Washington and his ax. On one side of the scene lies the felled cherry tree and an irate parent. On the other side stands voung George, resolutely holding onto his integrity. "I cannot tell a lie," he says. He may be a tree killer, but at least he's an honest one.

We never learn why George thought it would make good sport to chop down a fruit-bearing tree. That gleaming ax may have been too tempting to pass up. and the tree a haplessly close target for the blade. Of course the point of the story is not about environmentalism but what qualities make for a good president. Someone who can be counted on to fess up even to shortsighted and misguided decision-and presumably to accept the consequences—must have seemed an ideal candidate for the job.

What's left in the story, after George takes responsibility, is the stump of a tree, unable to give shade, bring forth blossoms in the spring, or produce fruit. A tree stump is a sad thing. It is a tombstone carved from the very thing it memorializes.

K, that was a bonus ax story. There are two more given to us in the lectionary this week. This time, the scene opens long after the chopping, and no one is taking any responsi-

bility. The house of Jesse, which is the house of David once removed, has been seats of power and accuse a dead stump for ages. Though God once promised most outrageous things. All David that his house would rule forever, it seems God must have had the divine fingers crossed during the pledge. The lineage of kings went as far as David's son Solomon, then the tree was split in two and rival kingdoms ruled and fought and were eventually subdued by stronger forces altogether. Long gone are the northern kingdom of Israel and the southern kingdom of Judah. What's left are the Roman occupation, a puppet king Herod, and a stump where the tree of Jesse once proudly stood. Is it too much to imagine, 10 centuries after the time of David, that the stump of Jesse would produce another king? The prophet Isaiah, writing only three centuries after David, still felt hopeful. The roots of

the kingdom are still there, he declares, and that is enough to produce a spring of renewed hope. The Spirit of the Lord is still willing to rest on such a king, and justice and peace might yet gather around his harmonic reign.

Then seven more centuries pass, and spring never arrives, and the king doesn't come. Is it reasonable to keep our hopes fastened on cial lamb, let it be added. this stump?

nter John the Baptist. Now here's a fellow vou don't want to trust with any stray axes lying



around. He's charismatic, fearless, confident, and wildly popular. He's perfectly willing to point at the their inhabitants of the of which happen to be true, but what is truth?

John also cannot tell a lie, and he'll lose his head for this indiscretion. In the meantime, he's calling everyone within the sound of his voice to repent, turn around, change your life, a new Kingdom is coming! John even quotes Isaiah, the prophet of the original "return of the king." At this point, the story begins to sound Tolkien-esque. The one who plunges all comers into the river proclaims the near arrival of one who will plunge his followers into Holy Spirit and fire. The average listener might wonder whether the times, bad as they were, really warranted a messiah.

And then John produces the eschatological ax, laid at the root of the trees from all eternity, ready to call forth God's justice by separating the fruit-bearing from the groundencumbering among us. If this doesn't strike you as good news, then be forewarned that it doesn't get any better than this in the prophecies of John. Even the mighty one, when he arrives, will be called the Lamb of God-the sacrifi-And though John wields the ax at the moment, it will come down on his own neck at the end. No one escapes the violence in John's proclamation. This

Kingdom, when it comes, comes bloody.

How about a nice Advent message?

ohn's call to repentance is not, we should point out, the gospel of Jesus Christ. The gospel is eponymously good news. John's intertestamental proclamation is more like Old Testament moralism as the Hebrew prophets served it up: Get your act together or know the wrath of God. Jesus begins his ministry on the hinge message of John: Repent, for the Kingdom is at hand. And then Jesus inaugurates this Kingdom and the universe swings wide open on its paradox. Sinners are now forgiven! The lame walk and the blind see! The dead rise again!

A hinge articulates in two directions, and so do the ministries of John and Jesus. If John emphasized the "repent" side of the message, Jesus spends more time telling stories of

the Kingdom and its ways. John isn't wrong, strictly speaking; nor does he ever become a follower of Jesus. His job is to complete the past, to be the last signpost on the way to the future. John seemed to know this, as when he later acknowledged the need to decrease as Jesus increases. Maybe his recognition that the old prophetic style was passing made it easier for John to speak the truth to power. If you're on your way out, why not take the pillars down with you like Samson did?

Something has to die in order for something else to live, the botanists tell us. Scripture has the same message. We have to let go of the past, the old ways, the old self, in order to usher in the new life we long for. We can't serve two masters, and we can't have it both ways. You want new life? First you have to die to the old one. Now where's that ax?




