Fulfilled in Our Hearing, and in Our Living

I imagine that every Bible in the world was about to be destroyed, and you only had time to snatch up one page for safekeeping. One page only, to be your moral guidepost and your consolation. One page of scripture to represent the whole message of the gospel!

Which page would you take?

Let's hope it never comes to this, of course, but we could do worse than rescuing the 13th chapter of Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. If we memorize this one citation for emergencies, we'll never be in doubt as to what our response to our gossip neighbor should be, or how to deal with an incorrigible teenager (or incorrigible parent), the boss at work, the politician we can't stand, or any person or issue under heaven, for that matter. Whatever the circumstances of our present trying situation, turning to 1 Corinthians 13 will afford a quick review of what we ought to be doing.

But we have to keep in mind this caveat: Scripture tells us what *we* should be doing, not the person with whom we are currently vexed. We can't aim the word of God at others, because, like a boomerang, it will faithfully return to the one who flung it.

In other words, when Paul tells us that love is patient, love is kind, it's *our* love that's being called onto the carpet.

**He should have said:
Love is hard**

Nobody ever said that living out 1 Corinthians 13 would be easy. Paul seems to suggest that some of us might prefer to move mountains or to hand over our bodies for burning before we'd give over our hearts for our neighbor's good. Because if it's true that love never fails, it's also true that love is not always the first impulse that clutches at our hearts when dealing with others. Normally we might wade through envy, irritation, rudeness, and a sense of superiority well before we get around to love. And if Paul were writing his love soliloquy today, he would most certainly add: Love is not sarcastic. A writer recently noted that if Jesus had come to the present generation, we would not crucify him. We would simply make fun of him—because that is the way modern people destroy their enemies.

Jesus learned all about the shortcomings of human love when he got up in the hometown synagogue to give a teaching. You might think a familiar crowd would be more supportive than a roomful of strangers. But ask any preacher whether he or she prefers the local parish or Peoria, and chances are they'd take Peoria. The problem with people who know you is that they *know* you. And when someone or something is known to us, we're most

likely to overlook them in favor of something more exotic. I have to admit I've often taken advice from a stranger on the bus, which seemed to come straight from heaven. It's harder to imagine that Aunt Rose might come to me with a word of the Lord. But maybe she has. If I close out that possibility, I'll never know.

Nazareth closed out on Jesus before he'd even begun. They admitted that his words were gracious, and they wondered how a kid down the street learned to talk like that. They also resented and resisted the idea that one of their own could teach them anything. So they found a way to shrink-wrap his message to the size of their narrow hearts: "Isn't this Joseph's boy?"

From gracious to gale force

Jesus would later tell his disciples not to throw pearls before swine. It may have been a lesson he learned here in Nazareth. His lovely overture about how God's word was fulfilled in their hearing this day had been dismissed. So Jesus told them what *else* was fulfilled: all the usual expectations of prophets who brought the power of God to their own people. Nazareth had been given the same opportunity once extended by the likes of Elijah and Elisha to the nation. But, as on those other occasions, only wid-

ows and strangers were not too proud to accept it. Which meant that Nazareth would become the rare town that would not see the miracles of Jesus at work in their midst.

We cannot be all that surprised when these words move the crowds to fury and violence. Prejudice is *not* patient or kind. If they could have killed Jesus that day in Nazareth, they would have. That is the ultimate price paid for telling the truth, and Jesus would pay that price only when the hour was right.

Time to gird your loins

At the heart of a prophet's work is the vocation to love. The first love of a prophet's life is the truth, which comes from God. The prophet's second love has to be the people themselves for whom the truth is given. It's tough to love the truth *and* the people, when the people plainly don't love the truth. That's why a prophet needs to be a

wall of brass when it comes to taking rebuttal.

And the work of a prophet is no longer an outside job, because the word of God *has* been fulfilled in our hearing, and we ourselves are the bearers of this truth to a world that clearly doesn't want to hear it. And the message won't get through if we are impatient, pompous, and self-righteous in our delivery. In fact, the only way anyone has ever accepted the truth is if it's loved into him or her. After all, how did we ever come to embrace it?

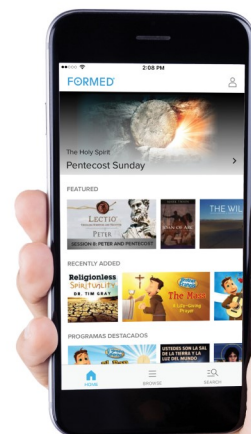
"Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things." And if we can put that much into practice and make it second nature to us, we won't have to make a single prophetic utterance beyond the compelling word of our lives. Bearing, believing, hoping, and enduring, we will have become everything we came to say.
