Lighting Up the World

Then I moved to the desert some years ago, my mother sent me an appropriate housewarming gift. It's a little lamp molded at the base into an adobe-style house, with a matching lampshade bearing a pleasing Southwestern pattern. When you turn on the lamp, at first you get what's expected: a wash of light under the lampshade. At the second click, however, the lights also go on in the windows of the little adobe house at the base. A third click leaves you in the dark again—but the lights of the little house are still burn-

Friends took to calling this novelty the "pueblo lamp." I looked up the word recently—pueblo technically means a communal dwelling or even a whole Native American village. But it also refers to a particular native people, or any member of that group. It's an intriguingly elastic word: a single building, a whole village, a tribe of people, or just one person.

I thought of how the word *church* functions in a similar way—I was about to say "in a similar light." I am church. We are church together. That building over there is church. And the milieu in which we live and move and have our being is church on a grand scale.

Of course, there is another way in which this analogy is helpful. Consider the exchange of light from the greater light of the primary lamp to the humble glow of the "pueblo" house. That, too, is a movement familiar to the church.

Called to the light

ant to live in the light? Then do justice, says the Lord. Share your bread, shelter the homeless, and clothe the naked. It's almost commonplace how often people return from a simple work of this nature and declare with amazement, "I got so much more than I gave." That "so much more," we could say, is the promised light.

When we move into the world's darkness bringing help and hope, we bear the light with us. It's not ours exactly, and it's not us either. Divine justice harbors its own light, and when we consent to surrender to its service, the light has a chance to rise in some of the darkest places around. Like the heart of a man on parole who is resigned to a life of revolving incarceration. Or the soul of a woman crushed by poverty and abuse for as long as she can remember. How about the needs of children who have seen more schools and more failure in the past five years than they can, literally, count? When we find the courage to touch those lives, the glory of the Lord goes ahead of us, and the gloom can indeed become like midday. This "glory of the Lord." understood as the *Shekinah* or hidden-vet

-manifest presence of the

divine, always did function

as a light in dark places. Remember the smoking brazier Abraham witnessed on the dark night of covenant, or the burning bush that appeared before Moses. Consider the pillar of fire that stayed with Israel during long desert nights, or the tongues of fire at Pentecost that lit the way for the nascent church. When we travel the way of holiness, we won't lack for light.

Called to be light

esus calls us the light of the world. That's an amazing proposition, considering that we regard him in the same way. He dares us to take that light and bathe the whole world with its brilliance. Well, how are we doing? How many people know we are Christians, by our love or by any other means? A fish on the bumper sticker of the car or a smudge of ash on the forehead just isn't enough. We can wear a cross around our necks or read our Bibles conspicuously during the coffee break, but that doesn't necessarily shed any light on our convictions.

No, the best way to be the light of the world is to shine before others through our example. We are called to be the Christbearers, bringing our little pueblo light before us as a testimonial of the greater light of Christ that we have witnessed. If we bear no light in our coming, then we can gesture all we want in the darkness about our faith, and no one will believe us or even compre-

hend what we are talking about. The only way to reveal the light is to be the light. The piercing of human darkness with a single ray of light is more powerfully convincing than all the religious chatter we are capable of.

Saint Paul knew this. That's why he put the theologizing and catechizing on hold when he went to Corinth. All he brought with him was knowledge of Jesus, and him crucified. That deep knowing led to demonstrations of Spirit and power instead of wisdom talk and religious argument. Sometimes I think the world would be a better place if we stopped talking about religion altogether and lived our creeds instead.

Shine before all

t must be the child in all of us that leads people to play with the pueblo lamp when they come to my house. Click-clickclick: The light begins at the top, is shared with the

bottom, and is finally left alone in the little house. The smallest light, summoned at that final click, is invariably the most charming. How tiny it is, and yet it dares to speak itself against the entire darkness of the night! The windows of the adobe house burn brightly as if inviting us in. It's like the porch light at the old homestead, reminding us that we are welcome at any hour.

Our lives can become this kind of invitation for others if we leave our Christlight burning at all times. Each of us, though a small sample of church, is at the same time an ambassador of all that church is meant to be. Christ has shared his light with us so that in our lives, however humble, the promise of that light speaks boldly against the darkness. Even the hour of death is not so dark that the light of Christ cannot pierce it. May our light so shine, now and always.


