Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

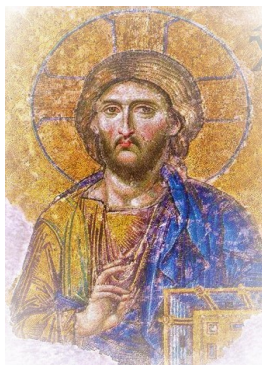

Looking for the Christ

Seen Jesus lately? Seriously, where would you go to look, if Jesus was the one you were looking for? The Catholic-school reflex reminds us to turn to the Eucharist. Surely Jesus can be found in the bread and wine on our Sunday table. The same reflex would point us to the tabernacle. Our faith assures us that Jesus is there, truly present, and we leave the light on perpetually to acknowledge that idea.

But is that it? Have we exhausted the places we might go to look for Jesus? Some of us may recall that Jesus is the Word of God, and so his presence can be discovered in the scripture we “break open and share,” an action much like our sacrament of Holy Communion. And some might remember that the priest is also a sign of Christ’s presence among us, the *alter Christus* in his role as presider at Mass. And others might know that the People of God who gather in the assembly are likewise the Body of Christ, the church. When we gather on Sunday mornings, Jesus, it seems, is everywhere.

But after we have composed this list of places where Jesus can be found, a few of us might run out of ideas. Jesus seems hard to miss on Sundays, but outside of Mass, is Jesus around at all?

How to recognize the one we seek

This is not a frivolous question, nor is it a new one. For a hundred years or more before the

time of Jesus, some members of the Jewish community were awaiting a leader anointed by God to save them from all that ailed them. Israel was a chronically oppressed nation occupying a fairly indefensible piece of land, and many hopes were pinned on the coming of a warrior-king like David to liberate them and bring prosperity and peace. What they were counting on was someone in equal parts holy man, soldier, and prince. They called this person *Messiah* in Hebrew, *Christ* in Greek. Not everybody believed there was a messiah on the horizon, but for some, that hope was all they had to hold onto.

So it’s no surprise that some who encountered the fiery preaching of John the Baptist wondered if he might be the Christ they were looking for. John showed the charisma, the power, the passion to lead armies; just look at the way he herded the crowds into the river for Baptism. He claimed to be starting a movement that would “prepare the way of the Lord,” too. Couldn’t that be the new government they were banking on, led by a ruler who bowed before God? (Herod, the adulterous old murderer and Roman collaborator, certainly wasn’t!) John was intent on purifying the nation of their sins to make them ready for something *big*. What else could it be, if not the return of the House of David?

But John was not willing even to pretend to play that

role and fulfill their hopes. He pointed out that he used water to lead the people to spiritual purity. But the One coming would be mightier; his baptism would be Spirit and fire!

Would you have known him?

Based on this description, many who followed John the Baptist still missed Jesus. They couldn’t abandon their preconceived notions of God’s anointed one to accept the One who actually arrived. They wanted a soldier-king, not a crucified Lord. The preaching and healing and miracles of Jesus’ active ministry were OK, but only if they “went somewhere”—meaning Jerusalem and the centers of power. Golgotha was definitely not the destination people had in mind.

Jesus *lived* Spirit and fire, and after he rose from the dead he bequeathed these gifts to the church. Not just the “church” as in Vatican City and the successors to Peter’s Chair, and not just to those who are ordained to lead the church in prayer and service. Everyone initiated into the Baptism of the Lord likewise receives Spirit and fire. We have all been *anointed*—“Christed”—with this holy gift. Not all of us express this anointed power, of course, but a gift remains given even if it’s never opened.

How to look like Jesus

So another answer to the question “Where’s Jesus?” is to look for the

Dear Parishioners,

With the middle of the flu season upon us, I'd like to share with you a few ways OLG will work to limit the spread of the flu virus starting on Mon, **Jan 14**:


- Communion will be offered in the form of consecrated bread alone.
- Consider receiving the host in the hand rather than by the mouth.
- Ministers, including priests, deacons, sacristans, servers and Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, are reminded to practice good hygiene by washing their hands before Mass. Hand sanitizer is available at the credence table for those ministers to use before and after the distribution of communion.
- Parishioners are never under an obligation to shake hands with others during the Sign of Peace; a statement of peace, bow or other gesture is appropriate.
- It is not necessary to hold hands for the Lord's Prayer. While commonly done, this gesture is not prescribed by the *Roman Missal*.
- Anyone who is ill, or suspects oncoming symptoms, is legitimately excused from attending Mass. Those who are sick may wish to watch a broadcast of the Sunday Mass on their TV or over the Internet at home and pray in solidarity with the parish community.

Thank you for understanding. Once the flu season is over, around mid-April, we will reinstitute our traditional means of sharing the Sign of Peace and parish norm of distributing communion from the cup at each celebration of the Eucharist.

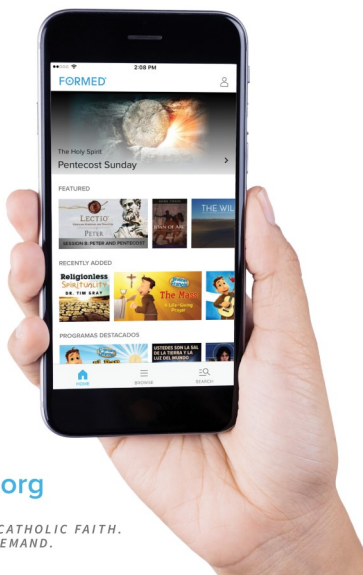

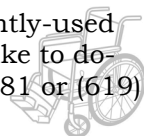

expression of Spirit and fire that he demonstrated in his life and gave to the church for all time. Whenever that Holy Fire is burning, that's where we'll find him. It should be smoldering in all of us right now.

Hopefully we can all count the holy fires of Christian Presence in our lives like rosary beads. Do you know people of passion and conviction who work for what they believe in no matter what the cost? There's Jesus! And how about the people whose love is so deep and faithful that you never have to ask—you *know* they are with you, supporting and rooting for you all the way. Count them in. And surely you know some folks who don't hang onto money and personal security and worldly advantage like the rest. Gotta be Jesus. How about folks who are so delightfully alive and full of joy that their company itself is

comfort and peace to all who know them? Yep, Jesus too. Those who demonstrate wisdom, those who heal—once you begin this list, you begin to see that Jesus is around quite a bit.

Look no further

If we find ourselves scratching our heads over where to look for Jesus, we are trying too hard. The gospels give us a pretty good idea what Spirit and fire looks like as a lifestyle.
