Looking for God

I f you went in search of God, where would you look? The great cathedrals of Europe, perhaps the basilicas of Rome? Would you seek out the famous holy men and women of our generation, or monks and cloistered nuns who have spent long years on such a quest? Would you read the ancient wisdom texts and sacred scriptures of our religion, or every religion?

Or would you widen your search beyond the boundaries of religion? Would you look to all things beautiful, like the National Parks or the Seven Wonders of the World? Would you include the beauty created by human hands in masterful paintings and statues and architecture and music? Is beauty the true face of God in our world?


Or what about the forces of power and might? Do they more accurately reflect the immanence of God in our world? Do "acts of God" as nature reveals them show us the divine face? Would you seek out the sites of great volcanoes as our ancestors did, to stand in awe of their terrible potential for death and destruction? Or would you visit standing armies and the thrones of kings as emblems of God's right hand and holy arm? Maybe few of us would look for a baby, an infant, helpless and innocent. Fewer still would look for

the baby of a poor couple, the baby of foreign origin and a strange religion. Some poor little baby in a common home, attended by unimportant parents, in a part of the world oppressed and occupied by a great empire.



God made manifest

piphany is an odd feast of the logically impossible, of seeking and finding the divine in the ordinary and the unimpressive. Historically, it's also been a very elastic celebration: In the Eastern and Western traditions of Christianity, Epiphany has included at various times the commemoration of the Nativity of Jesus, as well as the arrival of the Magi, the Baptism of the Lord, and the first miracle at Cana. The church once celebrated Epiphany as its own season, acknowledging that the search for God in our world is the task of every generation. God is here, present, alive, and worthy of worship. Like the wise Magi, we are invited to take the journey that ends on bended knee



of precious gifts. But like those wise men, we have to have some sense of how to take this journey. Though they did not know the destination, they did have a star to direct their course. What is the guiding star of our journey, and will we take the risks necessary to follow it? Christians might rightfully claim Jesus, the light of the world, as the star that guides us. And Catholics might follow Jesus to his Real Presence in the Eucharist, and bow before him in worship, and place a gift in the offering basket, and feel confident that they've taken the Epiphany journey to its end. Is the recognition of God in Christ its own end, we should ask ourselves? Is

should ask ourselves? Is our homage to Jesus at the Table of the Lord or in the Tabernacle the proper destination of our worship?

The story of the Magi as it's told in scripture doesn't offer much further information. We know that after they acknowledged the king in Jesus, they refused to follow the lead of King Herod, the symbol of worldly authority and power. We are told they went home by another way, but we don't know what way that was, or what home was like when they got back there. Legends persist about other journeys these wise ones took, journeys of faith

even deeper and more costly than this one, all the way to martyrdom. There are legends, too, about the so-called Fourth Magi, the one that missed Jesus at that earlier occasion but caught up with him in the final hour in Jerusalem. These legends didn't evolve to fill in the history of these remarkable seekers so much as to remind us that the journey of faith isn't over at the side of the crib.

Radiant at what we see

iblical tradition is D quite clear about what incarnate in a poor little happens to those who see God face to face: They die of the encounter! And in Baptism, we understand, our encounter with the life of Christ brings us to a similar conclusion. We die to self and live for God. It is no longer we who live but Christ who lives in us. The encounter with God costs us our lives, and if that is true, there is no possibility of kneeling in the Real Presence of God, offering our envelope, and then traveling home, back to our lives as usual. That life no longer exists.

Remember what happened to Moses when he ascended the mountain to stand in the presence of God. He returned radiant at what he saw, as Isaiah later puts it. The radiance was

unbearable to look at. so Moses had to veil his face. If we truly understood what we see in our Eucharist, perhaps we would become as radiant as children often do in their First Communion, or as newly married couples are when they turn from the altar to face their family and friends in the glow of the sacrament. Maybe the dimming of that initial radiance is because we have not taken the journey in faith, followed the light of the star, and come into the presence of Christ with full acknowledgment of where we have arrived. If we come upon Christ foreign baby and do not recognize his majesty there, how will we find him in a piece of bread?


Take the journey

ur goal, as Christians, is not to glow in a physical sense, of course. It's to bring light to the world by our presence and our actions. We are the light of the world, too, as Jesus points out. We become the light we follow, and we give what we have ourselves received. If we take the journey to the Eucharist and eat God's food, we become God's food for others. It's a hungry world out there. And we've already determined to go home by an unusual route.
