
Welcome to Our Lady of Grace!

GROW: I don't know about you, but even for the quickest of errands I don't like to leave my house without my smartphone. Nor would I go on a road trip without my trusty mini-Diet Coke and a snack or two. So I'm struck by what Jesus tells the Apostles when he sends them on their mission to share the Good News: "He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick - no food, no sack, no money in their belts." While it may be hard for us to imagine striking out with only the sandals on our feet, to me this reading is more about what the Apostles did have than life of the Church. In dowhat they went without: They had a companion (Jesus sent them two by two) and the spiritual blessings Saint Paul refers to, including a relationship with Jesus and absolute trust in him. Today's readings remind us to set aside distractions and spend time deepening our relationship with Jesus

through prayer, reading the Scriptures, and partic- it not been for the disciipating in the sacramental



ing so, we, too, can join in the mission of the early disciples by giving our lives to Jesus and sharing his message with others.

GO: I find the phrase "the new evangelization" somewhat ironic. After all. evangelization is not new, it goes back to the earliest days of the Church,

which wouldn't exist had ples. The "new" part reminds us that we today also share in this mission. The U.S. Catholic bishops describe it succinctly: "The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel." This call is both simple, and challenging, but we don't have to be perfect. After all, just as God called Amos, a humble shepherd, and Jesus called the Twelve, a motley group of fishermen, he calls us. Like them, our first "task" isn't a task at all – it is placing God and our relationship with Jesus at the center of our lives. Only then can we effectively share the Gospel with others, inviting our brothers and sisters to a life in Christ - to become part of God's adopted family.

WITNESS: At the end of Sunday Mass, we often hear the words: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." As we are sent forth, let us ask God to show us how we can share the Gospel with others during the week ahead. Then pay attention to where the Spirit leads us in answering our pray-



ooking back over my journey of parenthood, I know there were days when I traveled the extra mile for my children. What can I do to help our family practice our faith each day?

ome families practice their religion together as just another event on their schedule: go to church, observe Lent, help at the parish picnic, go to a meeting, volunteer time, make your confession, use your envelope... But the focus needs to be on who we are—God's people, in relationship with him, love, forgiven, and redeemed, and called to live and proclaim the Gospel. Our awareness of God's presence and our sense of mission are supported by the daily rituals, celebrations, and traditions that help us stay focused. Sharing our faith strengthens us and clarifies the beliefs and values of Christian living.

Daily family practices include time for prayer—before meals, before bed, before important meetings and activities. Attend Sunday Mass together and discuss the homily afterward. Create family celebrations for



holy day and holidays. Make religion a regular part of your discussions, Include others, especially the elderly and the less fortunate, in your activities and charitable efforts. By applying the virtues of faith, hope and love to each day, faith becomes part of who your family is. It influences how you act towards others, what you value, and how mindful of God you are. Faith is the leaven of life that helps all of us rise to our call and dignity as God's people.

What is a Mass Intention?

No, I won't do any more.

rom the days of the early Church it has been common practice to offer Mass for the dead, as well as for others.

Archaeologists have discovered epitaphs on tombs in the Roman catacombs, asking for prayers for the departed one. Numerous early Church Fathers witness to this practice. Recall from St. Augustine's "Confessions" St. Monica's one dying request, "that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be." Countless Christians have made this same request of their survivors.

In his encyclical *Mirae caritatis* (1902), Pope Leo XIII situated the offering of Mass for others in the true context of our concern for others, the Communion of Saints. "For

faith teaches us, that although the venerable Sacrifice may be lawfully offered to God alone, yet it may be celebrated in honor of the saints reigning in heaven with God who has crowned them in order that we may gain for ourselves their patronage. And it may also be offered — in accordance with an apostolic tradition — for the purpose of expiating the sins of those of the brethren who, having died in the Lord, have not yet fully paid the penalty of their transgressions" (No. 12).

Good to Know: Mass Intentions at OLG can be scheduled by a personal visit to the Parish Office. Only one Intention per Mass is scheduled except when a Mass for Collective Intentions is available. Mass Inten-

tions can be scheduled up to one year in the future.

We don't "pay for" or "buy a



Mass" because we cannot possibly afford it! The value of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is infinite. But it's good for the faithful to request a Mass for a specific intention and at the same time to make an offering to the priest to help support him and the church. In the Diocese of San Diego, the recommended offering per Mass Intention is \$10.00. A Mass card noting the date and time of the Mass for the Intention is available at the time of scheduling.

Mass Intentions are published weekly in the parish bulletin.
