The answer to our pravers

f you could have anything, what would you ask for? One man knows at once what his heart desires: "A red Ferrari!" A harried parent declares: "A long vacation without the kids." Still another dreams of tuition for college, and the list grows longer as we all dream together: a house by the sea, marriage to a movie star, the safety of loved ones, a miraculous healing, a million dollars, peace on earth. Some of our wishes are motivated by self-interest, whim, or a steady diet of television. Others may be selfless, sensible, or even noble.

But in all the years I've listened to folks talking starry-eyed about their dream acquisition, I've never heard anyone ask for what young Solomon wanted when God put the question to him in a dream. "Give me an understanding heart," the young man said. It would appear that he was already well on his way to having one.

And this is the punchline of most Wisdom literature, ironically enough: The wise seek wisdom, and fools love foolishness. So in a sense, the prayer for wisdom is something only the wise are praying for.

You can never be too wise

f course, we all know how Solomon turned out: wiser than any scholar and philosopher of his age and perhaps any age. He

made an admirable judgment regarding the child with two mothers. He certainly impressed the shrewd Queen of Sheba. But very smart men can still make very dumb choices, and Solomon made his share. He did build a lavish temple to honor the Lord, taking seven long vears to do it. But then he spent 13 years building his own palace, showing a startling lack of proportion. Add this to the forced labor upon which these monuments were built, and the hard taxes levied to support these projects, and the toll of human suffering mounts.

God warns Solomon of one line he must not cross, and that's in the veneration of foreign gods. The temple will be repudiated and the people will become a byword of loss among the nations if the ban on idol worship is breached. No warning could be clearer. So what does the wisest man on earth do? Marries 700 foreign women and takes 300 concubines besides. Shrines to strange gods were not far behind. So maybe wisdom isn't all it's cracked up to bewhich is to say, it isn't enough. Wisdom has to be attached to a human will humble enough to submit to it in order to be effective. Otherwise, being able to recite Ben Sira, Deepak Chopra, the Dalai Lama, and even Jesus Christ from memory may make you a hit at rarified gatherings, but it won't make you truly wise.

Kingdom wisdom

ingdom wisdom isn't the same as conventional wisdom, that's for sure. Parables of the Kingdom often employ paradox in order to tweak our vision of reality and leave it somewhat askew. It's awfully easy for egocentric humans to become convinced that we have a lock on the truth, be it political, moral, or religious. Every time Jesus spoke of the Kingdom, therefore, it was with an eye to destabilizing our understanding. The last will be first, the least greatest, virgins shall give birth, and the dead will rise. What we expect will not come to pass, and what we believe to be frankly out of the question is somehow suddenly the only possible scenario.

What can we do with such implausible, uncomfortable wisdom? We can avoid the near occasion of it and stop coming to church. We can ignore it, dismissing it as so much religious candy at the sideboard of an otherwise wholesome feast. We can call it metaphor and mean that it is not to be taken literally or seriously. Or we can entertain the possibility that everything we are raised to value and seek in this world is utterly worthless; and everything we dread, fear, and despise in this world is to be prized. In other words, we become madmen and madwomen, running around like Fran-

cis of Assisi declaring that, the worse things get, the

better they are; the more we are despised, the happier we are. Is this healthy? Is this reasonable? Is this what Jesus wants from us?

"Do you understand all these things?"

he right answer to Jesus' question is: No. The disciples, being the lug nuts they are, say Yes. Yes, they fully appreciate that a person who finds a treasure buried in a field will sell everything he has to buy the field. They understand that a merchant who knows the value of a pearl will divest himself of all his resources to acquire the finest one. As fishermen, they see the wisdom in evaluating the contents of one's net, keeping the good fish and throwing the inedible ones away. They are willing to bet that the angels in heaven will do the same in separating the wicked from the righteous. What they fail to appreciate is how all of this applies to them—how absolutely transforming it would be to give away the

life you have for a life you cannot see. They might trade up, as they did when they left their nets to follow Jesus—that makes sense. But what about the day when it is time to trade down, from discipleship to martyrdom? What about when it's their turn to be buried like that treasure in the field, or when buying the pearl means biting the Big One?

More precious than gold

s the mystics like to say, humility is the first step toward wisdom and it's every step after that. We can't fully understand why the Kingdom turns worldly reality upside down, and why everything we've been taught to want is going the way of moths and rust. We can be forgiven for needing a few moments to collect ourselves, to shed a few tears for the wealth we've been seeking and hoarding, to say goodbye to the red Ferrari and the tropical island paradise of our dreams. The pearl awaits us. Are we going to buy it, or just admire it from here?


