Burdens Galore

ook out over the aver-✓ age assembly and what do you see? For one thing, you see that there is no average assembly. A parish in a wealthy suburb may present a sea of nicely dressed and clean-shaven folk, none of whom seem to have gone gray despite their AARP cards. In a city parish, exhausted young mothers pass out Cheerios to pacify squirming children, while homeless folk sleep in the back pew or wander the aisles in agitation, presenting the constant possibility of a fullscale liturgical interruption. In a small town, miners have cleaned as much soot from under their nails as possible for Sunday morning, while the unemployed slump despondently next to the children they are unsure how to feed. In all of these parishes and many others, people bring their burdens to church. In that sense, then, there is an average assembly; which is to say, everybody's know what else to do, so got problems.

You don't have to watch the evening news to find out what people are worried about. Think back on the past year of ministry. The bereaved family carried their loss to the church. The woman seeking an annulment from a bruising marriage was sitting in the congregation. So were the teenagers anxious about their burgeoning sexual awareness, the families in financial crisis, the depressed office worker who could hardly function on the job anymore, the mother of the boy who was

arrested, the gay man who felt rejected and denied by God and the church, the woman who'd just been diagnosed with cancer. People have all sorts of troubles with their relationships, their health, their careers, and their bank accounts. They worry about moral choices and what God thinks of them, too. They wonder if anything they do has meaning. They suspect sometimes that they have made irredeemable mistakes.

Come to me

stockbroker who'd been raised in a Catholic family was in trouble, and he knew it. He made a lot of money and enjoyed a fabulous lifestyle, but none of that mattered anymore. He drank too much; he lived to drink. It was starting to affect his career. It had already cost him many significant relationships. He was lonely. He was full of self-loathing. He didn't one Saturday night he stumbled into the nearest church, something he hadn't done in a long time. He didn't come for anything in particular—impulse and buried memory had brought him there. He sat in the pew uncomfortably and looked into the face of a small boy in the arms of his father in the pew ahead of him. The child was smiling at him over the father's shoulder. He returned the smile painfully. Mass was in progress, and the stockbroker had arrived in time for the gospel: "Come to me, all you who labor and



are burdened, and I will give you rest." Rest! Tears sprang up in the troubled man's eyes. Wouldn't it be astonishing, wonderful, incredible, to find rest somewhere? To find it, so simply and unreservedly, in the embrace of Jesus?

The small boy smiled benignly at him again from the forward pew. The man took it as a sign from God. He wept, rocking and softly repeating those saving words: Come to me, come to me.

You will find rest

he story above is true. The stockbroker later became a priest and is now preaching the same gospel he once heard so acutely. But it's a true story in more ways than one. These words from Jesus are immensely powerful, and we cannot discount how important they could be to someone, or many someones, you preach to this weekend. Say them like you mean them, like you believe them. Do you believe them? It will help if vou do.

We all know that religion isn't just about consolation—but there is consolation in it for those who seek and find the arms of Jesus. And we face a world out there badly in need of some good news, something to hope for, something to help with the pain of living. Some folks will turn to therapy, Prozac, and 12step programs, and some would be well advised to do so. But others will move deeper into addiction, numbness, bitterness, or



despair. Jesus offers to take up all these burdens and to make possible what seems absolutely impossible. That is his offer, and he is most serious.

People will ask: But how can you know this? We have only to point at the cross. Some may wonder: How you can trust someone you do not know to help you? Ah, but we do know him. We can share our experiences. Folks will look to us to show how Jesus makes a difference in our lives. Let's hope we have some evidence of this! The people in the parish will say: Please don't lie to me. It would hurt too much to hope and be disappointed again. So we must be sure that we tell the gospel truth and not some platitude we were told ourselves that allows us to hide the suffering world away.

A dominion from sea to sea

To one and nothing is beyond the compassion of Jesus. Sinners, lawbreakers, and others who feel unclean are welcome to come to him. It is our job to issue the invitation and to make that welcome authentic. I know a priest who, at the start of every Mass, acknowledges Catholics who have been away with an encouraging word. Another greets Christians of other denominations and those of other faiths who may be worshipping with us. Statistics bear out that there are lots in both categories in our midst. We might also greet those who almost didn't worship today, those who are not yet sure of the forgiveness of God or the love of Christ. If our communities hear a word that speaks to them and rouses their faith, they may be tempted to come back for more.

A Little Humor



St. Augustine Zhao Rong, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs

Killed from 1648-1930 ~ Feast Day Jul 9

- + This group of martyrs includes 120 men, women, and children, including 85 Chinese, who gave their lives for the Catholic Faith.
- + Martyred over the course of several centuries, this diverse group also includes 33 European missionaries from the Dominicans, Franciscans, Jesuits, Parish Foreign Mission Society, Salesians, PIME Missionaries, and sisters from the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary.
- + Saint Augustine Zhao-Rong, for whom the group is named, was a native Chinese priest from the Su-Tchuen Province. Arrested because of his Christian faith and ministry, he died in prison in 1815.
- + The earliest of the martyrs to be honored in this group is Saint Francis Ferdinand de Capillas, a Dominican priest who was martyred in the Fujian Province in 1648. He is honored as the proto-martyr of the Martyrs of China.
- + The Martyrs of China were canonized in 2000 and are honored collectively as the patron saints of China.

The Christian Faith was introduced in China in the 5th century and the first church was built there in the 7th century. During the Tang Dynasty (618-907), the Christian community flourished. The first Chinese diocese was established in Beijing in the 13th century.
