### Pairing Up for Mission

t is not good for human beings to be alone, no less a personage than God once observed. Hermits and misanthropes notwithstanding, the need for belonging and community is fairly well substantiated by our experience. People live longer in couples than as singles, and when one half of an older couple dies, often the other is not long in following. Nurturing family units are good for their members as well as for society as a whole. Neighbors who are caring of one another make for safer neighborhoods. Nations in partnership are better off than isolated governments in hostile postures to those beyond their borders. Where cooperation and mutual support is sought after, peace is a possibility.

The reverse thesis is also obvious: Where mutuality is missing, chaos and conflict result. Gender violence, intergenerational mistrust, racial wars, ethnic hatred, oppression of one class by another all flow from the insistence on keeping power or privilege at the disposal of one group only. When two sides of a society pull apart, fear and suffering for all parties is inevitable.

John Donne offered the perfect metaphor for the geography of human belonging: "No man is an Island, entire of itself; every man is a piece of the Continent, a part of the main." For those who find Donne too stuffy an authority, look no further than A. A. Milne's wise philosopher

Piglet, who once reminded Winnie-the-Pooh: "It's friendlier with two."

#### Tearing apart the whole

he Bible presents the world as we know it evolving through a series of deliberate rifts. Male and female are set against each other in the isolation of the first sin, as each seeks to deflect the blame for a personal failure. Not long after, brother turns against brother, and then creation turns on itself in the ancient story of the flood. All of life would have been wiped from the earth if not for divine intervention. Yet not long after the reestablishment of the human race through Noah's rescued line, humanity makes one final, fateful choice in the name of arrogance. The punishment is unusually creative: Human beings are represented by the decursed with a diversity of languages, and through the confusion of speech, burdened by nationhood. Now they are truly a divided people, as sin inevitably leads us to be. The ultimate visitation of sin on the human race is that we are so far adrift from our original unity that we cannot even make ourselves understood to our own kind.

Because of the separation that sin creates, peace, justice, and equality are forfeit in our world. One side always seeks the advantage over another, and domination and oppression become the only two seats on the seesaw of most cultures. But is there a way

off the seesaw and into a dynamic of balance and harmony? The redistribution of wealth and privilege in the reign of God provides the blueprint: The first become last, the adult becomes like the child, the poor receive the good news for a change, healing comes to the sick, and new life to the dead. This is by no means the easy way to peace, but Jesus assures us it is the only way. How soon do you suppose before the world is prepared to translate these terms into viable politics?

#### The way to re-union is through the church

hen Jesus sends out the 72 (or the 70 in some translations), they are a model for stitching together the severed threads of human society. The number refers to the "table of the nations" once scendants of Noah soon to be scattered by the Tower of Babel fiasco. This group of disciples numerically stands for all the nations. and their mission is likewise to all nations. They do not go off in lonely directions but two by two, like the animals on the ark. This is a hopeful image. The world may get another chance to start over and renew the face of the earth!

What is the message of this band of believers? "Peace to this household," they are told to announce wherever they go. It is up to the inhabitants to decide whether or not to accept this blessing. Peace will only







remain with those who are peaceful, Jesus warns.

If those disciples knocked on our doors today and wished us peace, would the blessing remain with us or flee from our midst? It is sorrowful to imagine that, heart by heart, we might reject the peace of Christ from our homes because we are not prepared to be peaceful people. Too many factors still divide us one from another. We are still unforgiving of those who have hurt us, angry or jealous or arrogant or fearful in regard to our neighbors. We judge and condemn whole cultures we do not know or understand. If people are not like us, all too often we automatically presume they are misguided or wrong or downright evil.

Two by two, the disciples deliver the message of peace to all the places Jesus intends to visit. These messengers are the forerunners of Christ himself. If we do not receive their

blessing, it does not bode well for when Jesus calls upon us in person.

#### Forming our pairs

Te are charged with the responsibility to receive the peace of Christ into our hearts, but also to deliver it to others, two by two. Some of us are naturally paired by marriage and don't have to look far for our partner in spreading the peace. But there are many more pairs to consider: parent and child, siblings, best friends, parish leader and parishioner, employer and employee, teacher and student, manufacturer and customer, politician and constituent, young and old, male and female, rich and poor, Catholic and Protestant, and so many more. If we do not reach across to the "other," whomever he or she might be in every circumstance of our lives, the peace we hunger for will remain an illusion. It's friendlier with two and outright impossible alone.
