Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

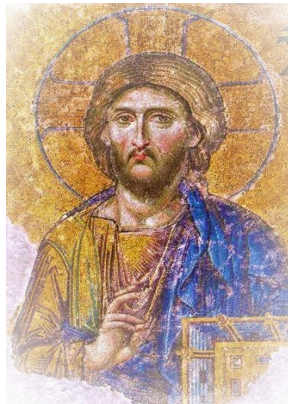

It's No Mystery

A lot about religion gets relegated to the overcrowded room of “mystery”: unknowable, unprovable, intangible, invisible. In theological terms, mystery is that which cannot be fathomed by human reason alone, or which depends upon the gift of divine revelation to be grasped. We can get sloppy about the appeal to mystery, however, and start to use it as a catchall for painful intersections where our teaching and our experience are at variance, or simply to silence questions that challenge our authority. Not everything about God is a total mystery, obviously. If the Bible is to be taken seriously, God has spent human history in the task of self-revelation and a relentless bid for intimate relationship with us. God’s self-communication has made the divine will seem not very mysterious at all, truth be told. In story, in law, in oracles, and in supernatural acts, God has been surprisingly transparent about what the divine intentions for our happiness are.

So if any mystery is left in what God wants of us, it is that we are still so vague about the plan. Listen to the rants of televangelists and milk crate preachers in the park, and be amazed at all the ways God’s words are manipulated to make an idiosyncratic point. Ask three people of the same religious persuasion to explain a particular doctrine, and stand aghast at how we routinely domesticate teachings to support a pre-

determined worldview. As is often noted, after God created human beings in the divine image, we returned the favor by creating an image of God that mirrored us to a T. So long as this mirror-image God we worship affirms the way we choose to live, the whole system of religion hums right along quite nicely.

Not exactly rocket science

Moses was the first to suggest that we can’t plead ignorance when it comes to knowing the divine will. He insists that we all know darn well what God wants from us. God’s will is not up in the sky or across the sea, some exotic formula lost in translation and perceived through a cosmic mist. It is near to us, speaking in the yearning of our hearts, warning us in the mutterings of conscience, obvious through the long, sad lessons of history. If we do not hear the voice of the Lord proclaimed in story and symbol, word and sacrament, personal history and communal experience, it is not because God has fallen silent or is being deliberately mysterious. Refreshingly, God’s law is written in stone and hasn’t changed much since then. If anything, it has become even more sharply outlined over time, written on hearts of flesh as the prophets foretold, so that we have become the *aleph* and *bet* of God’s purposes. As Saint Paul reminded the community at Corinth, those who follow Jesus become letters written in the Spirit,

known and read by all.

Moses’ declaration concerning the evident nature of God’s truth matches our experience pretty accurately. Most of us have had the experience of being asked for advice from a friend in trouble. Inevitably, the friend knows what must be done to avert disaster and is fairly clear on the outcome of each road that might be taken. The problem is never what to do, but finding the resolve to do the right thing. Rarely do we wander blindly into the path of adversity. Some instinct for right and wrong warns us well in advance that the decision we just made is not wise, honest, or good. If we pursue it to the end, we will wind up more or less where “it was written” that we would. Or if we get off scot-free this time, it is only a prelude to getting caught further down the line, where the stakes are higher and the voice of conscience has become muted from disuse.

Knowing what to do and doing it are not the same thing. When ethical dilemmas do confound us, it is usually not the terms of the choice that are unclear, but simply that we are standing in our own way and blocking the light available to us.

Jesus and the scholar

A scripture scholar came to Jesus with a question basic to the religious enterprise: “What must I do to inherit eternal life?” From the first, we sense his insincerity. If he is a scholar, he comes to

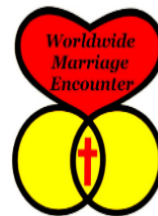
Marriage Help!

this question with a host of presuppositions about the answer. This is not the earnest question of a truth seeker, then, but a test of Jesus' own credentials. This prompts Jesus to direct the question back to the scholar, who replies from within the safety of the "Moses zone" with a chestnut from the Law: Love the Lord completely and your neighbor as yourself. Jesus tells him bluntly, then, to do it. Ah, but that is the delicate heart of the matter, isn't it?

But the scholar can't leave well enough alone and does what scholars do best, splitting fine hairs further by asking for clarification on the definition of "neighbor." I asked my 10-year-old niece what a neighbor is, and she had no problem defining the term. The scholar's second question underscores his game playing, and so Jesus decides to tell him a little story that sounds the truth loud and clear. At

the end, even the cagey scholar has to admit that he knows which character in the story acted like a neighbor.

Do mercy likewise

The story of the Good Samaritan is the fundamental building block of Sunday school morality. Luke's Jesus has posited compassion as the essential response of God to a world of misery and sin. If we face a fork in the road, our direction is simple: choose mercy. If we don't know how to behave, be compassionate. When confronted with obstacles and enemies, there is only one route through, and that is to forgive. We feel a mortal tug toward self-righteousness, judgmentalism, prejudice, and pride, but none of those paths are available to us if we are using the Christian road map. The answer to life's dilemmas is generally a simple one. It is the application that so far confounds us.
