What's Cooking?

ontemplatives and actives: Can't we all just get along? It's not like a battlefield exists out there somewhere, with a line drawn in the sand between those who pray and those who serve. No serious Christian is against worship or thinks that practicing what one preaches is irrelevant. Most believers would admit that attending to God's word is essential to the spiritual life and so is the outward response to our neighbor. So where's the argument?

I don't want to lay the ignition of the conflict on Jesus, but it didn't help on a memorable day in Bethany when he championed one sister over another. Family members are often notoriously different, and one person's delight is another's torment. Perhaps Martha was good in the kitchen. Mary seemed glad enough to seize the chance to be elsewhere. Among believers of my acquaintance, some are drawn to prayer, liturgy, and retreats like catnip. Others would rather organize the whole church social singlehandedly than to have to sit through one decade of the Rosary or attend an hour of Bible study. It becomes obvious, after knowing such personalities through years of church ministry, that neither is necessarily closer to God or tality at the top of the primore serious about the Christian journey than the other. Expressions of piety can be no more than a personality quirk, and banging pots and pans around can be a religious act. No con-

clusions can be drawn about people on the basis of appearances, in church behavior more than in most places.

How come Abraham gets a pass?

heck out the scene under the terebinth tree to further confuse the issue, if you are unconvinced. Abraham was dozing on a hot desert day when God arrived under the guise of three silent figures on the road. Did Abraham prostrate himself at their feet and remain in an attitude of perpetual adoration? Did he beg for wise teaching or seek moral instruction about certain matters pertaining to his neighbors in Sodom and Gomorrah? No. he sprang into an athletic show of extreme hospitality that would have made Martha of Bethany envious. Even Martha Stewart might not have seen to the slaughter of a whole steer for the occasion, but when it comes to hosting, Abraham belongs in the hospitality Hall casseroles over sevenof Fame.

The preparation of the steer also clues us in to the timetable upon which this meal depends. Abraham is banging pots and pans for quite a while before he exchanges one word with his august company. And this would have been in keeping with the Jewish moral code, which placed hospiority list. In desert lands, travelers had to depend on a kind reception from strangers for their very survival. Abraham may be a stellar host, but he is also demonstrating a trait



much to be admired by the hearers of this story.

In return for his hospitality, Abraham's guests finally speak and promise him the one desire of his heart: a son. All of this is a long way of saying that once upon a time, God appreciated a good meal from a dedicated host. It would seem that "Mary's way" was not always deemed the better part.

Another day, another kitchen

N ot a few preachers will have mixed feelings this Sunday. We may not have the heart to chide Martha and exalt Mary—in fact, many of us are secret Marthas and are rather disappointed that Jesus deals with a dedicated worker by telling her to slow down. But is that really the point of the lesson, or have we overlooked what's actually going on?

Franciscan scholar Robert Karris has wryly noted that Jesus is not advocating course meals here. In fact, Luke's gospel more than any other shows Jesus as a big fan of mealtime, always happy to be at table with religious leaders and sinners alike. The meal is an important theme for Luke, so it would be unfair to think that Jesus is being dismissive of Martha's desire to set a fine table for him

For Jesus to be in a house alone with two women, however, as he seems to be in this story, was shockingly countercultural. This would have been apparent



to the original audience of this story: both that Jesus dared to be with women and to let them serve him. and that he valued them enough to offer to teach them. This is the only gospel story, except perhaps for the Samaritan woman at the well, in which Jesus is shown instructing women exclusive of the male disciples. As much as Luke bread from heaven-food emphasizes table fellowship, he also insists on the equality of women in the presence of Jesus. These two themes come together in the house of Mary and Martha, as they prepare to enjoy a meal and the company of their Lord.

But a third theme emerges in this story, and that is the recognition of the host. Is Martha in charge of the hospitality as she prepares the meal, or is Jesus as he offers his word? At the Christian Eucharist, we may ask, who is host and who is guest? The Holy One once asked King David the same question more or less: Will you pre-

pare a home for me, the Maker of the universe? Though we may have a hand at setting the table, it is God who offers this meal to 118.

Jesus our host

T ary's better part is to recognize that she always comes into the presence of Jesus as guest, receiving from him the word of life, living water, for the soul by any other name. Martha's groaning board will not go unappreciated. But she must not lose sight that, when it comes to dinner with Jesus, he is the one who serves, and he is the meal itself. If she chooses to feed him and forgets to be fed herself, she will certainly miss the better part. Knowing the strong faith that Martha exhibits elsewhere, we can be sure she took these words to heart.
