Making Room for Prophets

hen I was 14, I was the sort of shy, nervous adolescent you find in every high school. I hung with a group of 10 friends, all of whom shared a gawky lack of confidence. Our bond was that we were in hiding together, mutually scared of being visible whether that meant being called on to perform in class or spoken to by anyone not belonging to our group. We didn't join clubs, try out for sports or plays, or run for student offices. No one thought of us in terms of leadership potential, and few teachers even noticed us.

But one teacher did. She took us aside individually and talked to us about our academic strengths and possibilities. She commented on the little things that made each of us interesting: one girl's sharp wit. another's head for science, the way a third used language poetically. She even told me, quite improbably, that I was the unacknowledged center of the group and that people followed my lead whether I knew it or not. Most of us didn't know what to make of these strange ideas being injected into our midst. Was there any truth in these things, or was it all just grown-up pep talk? We didn't know what to believe, but we felt the hunger generated in us to hear more. This one teacher's words became words of life for us, because they saw through who we thought we were, all the way to who we might become.

Before this teacher spoke to us, my mission in life was to fade into the woodwork and become no one in particular. Everything I've done and been since that encounter is due in some degree to her prophecies about me. We think of prophets as people who predict the future, when in fact their message is acutely aimed at the present. The only weapon wielded by the prophet is the truth, and that is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

A double portion of prophecy

If we understand the story correctly, Elijah and Elisha were the greatest prophets of Hebrew history, and Elisha inherited a double portion of what his master had, which makes him the number-one prophet of Old Testament times. As if to prove the point, the Second Book of Kings records twice as many miraculous and prophetic acts by Elisha as Elijah had performed. When we peruse the list floating ax heads, multiplied loaves, the redemption of poisoned stew, one child raised from the dead while others are mauled by bears—we are forced to consider that not all miracles are created equal. But when it comes to the deliverance of oracles in particular, we acknowledge a remarkable similarity. The death of a king is prophesied, and the man dutifully meets his end. Another man is destined to rise, and he takes his place on the throne in due time.



Kingdoms are won and battles are lost on a word from the prophet.

We might ask the question:

Is it the word of the prophet—understood to be the efficacious word of the Lord—that makes these things come true? Or does the prophet simply tell what is to come, a future that would have come into being even if it had not been spoken into the world beforehand? In other words, is the power of the prophet in promoting or predicting a certain reality? The two might have more in common than what distinguishes them. When I think of the observations my high school teacher made about each of us long ago, I realize she didn't say any more than what was already there. But would we have recognized those qualities in ourselves and acted on them if we had never heard them spoken out loud? Do prophets simply harness the creative power of the word to become flesh and dwell dynamically in our midst?

The prophet's reward

Tesus taught his disciples that to receive a prophet is as good as receiving what a prophet inherits—the person and the gift are inseparable. Clearing space for prophecy to inhabit our lives as the Shunemite woman did allows us to participate in the gift of prophecy as much as if we became prophets ourselves. What is not said is that aligning ourselves with prophets means we might also share

in the destiny of prophets, which is often to be persecuted and put to death for speaking unpopular truths. No one said the truth was easy to live with. Jesus, who calls himself the Truth, is predictably a challenging housemate. But beyond the threat of death, prophets bring with them the hope of life where it has seemed impossible, as the Shunemite woman discovers. Life from barrenness, life restored even after death has claimed it, is reliable territory for those who wield the word of God. This is why Paul has no hesitation in suggesting that we are baptized into the death of Christ—and that such a sacramental share in death will enable us to live in newness of life. Dying with Christ is the surest route to a release from the power of death altogether. Not everyone is going to accept this word, of course. And without ac-

ceptance, prophetic words like these may not bear their reality home to us.

Amen, let us not lose this reward!

hurchgoers have one ✓ huge advantage over those who spend Sunday morning at home with the weekend paper. We hear the efficacious word of God proclaimed reliably to us many times over, in the three readings of the Liturgy of the Word, not to mention the psalm we chant responsively and the scripture-based hymns we may sing together throughout the Mass. We have the Word made flesh delivered into our hands in the Eucharist, and we swallow this same Word from the cup poured out for our sake. Over and over for an hour, the Word that changes everything comes into our midst and is offered to us. We can depart each celebration with new possibilities if we embrace the Word as true for us.
