A Season of Gift Giving

Talk about a season for gift giving and most folks naturally assume you mean Christmas. That's the time when God came to earth, took on human flesh, pitched a mortal tent, and dwelled among us, right? And our response to all that goodness coming into the world is to give gifts in honor of our King, much the way the Magi did.

But this is the wrong time of year to be having this conversation! Today we celebrate Pentecost, on the liturgical dial about a theological 180 degrees around the circle from the Nativity. Today we celebrate how God comes to earth, inhabits human flesh, and dwells among us manifested in a diversity of gifts.

Is the coming of the Holy Spirit a kind of second Christmas, then? Certainly it is a spiritual echo of that earlier arrival, for this time God comes among us, not as one of us, but within all of us. At the feast of the Nativity we give gifts, but on this feast of Pentecost it is God who gifts us. And what sort of presents does God have for us? The prophet Isaiah lists a generous baker's half-dozen: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, courage, reverence, and awe. These gifts are given to the whole church so that we may want for nothing until Christ returns in glory. That day, we can imagine, will be a third kind of Christmas. In fact, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux spoke

of three "comings" of Christ in much this same way.

Bernard's three comings

Saint Bernard first noted that Christ came into history and is anticipated once more at the end of history. But it is the third coming, chronologically the arrival in the *middle* according to Bernard, that is the most crucial for us at this time. It is *this* coming, the daily presence of Christ in our midst, that empowers the church until the end of the age. It is through the Holy Spirit that we experience and express this presence, for Christ sent us his Spirit to remain with us, as he promised.

So today we celebrate a great arrival, which spawns a great season of gift giving lasting on the church calendar for 34 weeks but, historically speaking, enduring until the end of the world as we know it. We have come into possession of seven gifts, which in turn yield nine fruits in our lives. According to Saint Paul, these are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. We should know this group as well as we were once pressed to memorize the other ones. I'd type them into the bulletin side by side if it were mine to do. I'd urge the community to tape these to the bathroom mirror and contemplate them at the start of every day.

Because a community of

wisdom and courage, habitually practicing joy and kindness, would be a blessing for the whole world! The church is christened for this mission. We are anointed to become just such a people. If we open these marvelous divine presents and put them to good use, we become more than disciples. We will become apostles!

Gifts, fruits, and roles

The gifts of the Pentecost season just keep arriving like UPS the week before Christmas. Saint Paul also tells us that the church is given the authority to exercise certain necessary roles and functions. In order for our service to be unfettered, we are first given equal value in the eyes of the community by our baptism. Here is a gift the world does not give! Insider or outsider (Jew or Gentile), servant or served (slave or free), privileged or demeaned (male or female) by worldly standards, we are all worthy within the Body of Christ.

Because there are different services to be performed, we are called to varied tasks, but each one contributes to the whole. Paul lists these roles in terms of what we might call vocations: as apostles, prophets, teachers, healers, helpers, administrators, and those called to charismatic speech. Before we are tempted to exempt ourselves from this exalted-sounding list, we might try renaming these in more familiar terms: roles of leadership, parenthood and

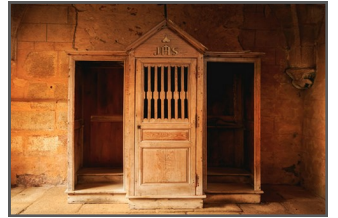
"Seal of Confession" Threatened

A matter of great urgency related our ability as Catholics to freely provide and receive the Sacrament of Confession in California has arisen in the form of a proposed law, Senate Bill 360. The "Seal of Confession" – so important for the penitent to feel that they can freely confess their sins and find Reconciliation with God – would be broken by SB 360. This proposed government intrusion into such a central Catholic practice is an affront to our faith and it should be viewed by all as a threat to religious liberty. Our Church is fully supportive of legal initiatives to prevent child abuse. Dioceses throughout the State have devoted a tremendous amount of human and financial resources to training, protective measures and reporting on this issue.

It is important that we as Catholics make our voices heard to those lawmakers who will decide whether this bill becomes law. Please contact by phone or email your State Assembly Member immediately. **Tell him**

or her to vote 'No' on SB 360. You may also make your voice heard through the Action Alert process of the Catholic Legislative Network by going to the parish website olg-church.org and clicking on the "News" Quick Link on the left side of the homepage.

guidance, consolation, service, organization, prayer, and preaching. The church is promised these vocations, which means they reside in our midst right now. If we are holding back on our contribution, the church is crippled by that decision. If we are unclear of our true vocation, we should make that discernment our highest priority.

Even more gifts!

When Jesus comes knocking on the door of our hearts, he doesn't come empty-handed. Of course, a locked door doesn't always stop Jesus from breaking and entering when the stakes are high enough. Jesus entered the upper room after the Resurrection through a closed door and beyond every fear the disciples carried within them. He came into their midst bringing peace, the breath of the Holy Spirit, and the forgiveness of sins. Could the human race ask for anything more? How many presents does God

have to send before we break down and admit that no one loves us and lavishes more care on us than God does?

When we consider the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit, the charisms and vocations promised to the church, and the extravagance of Christ's peace and reconciliation, we can only respond with awe and thanksgiving for the generosity of God in this season of divine gift giving. We, the church, have everything we need to fulfill our great purpose. If anything is wanting in the church, it is in our individual acceptance of these gifts and our failure to bring them to fulfillment in our lives. It would be strange and foolish of us to sit surrounded by presents from a loved one and choose not to open them! Especially as these are the very things our world is longing for most of all.
