Hold onto the Excitement!

ecently I was asked to give my testimony in a Presbyterian church. As the guest speaker at a weekend conference on the gospels, I had already given two talks before this assembly. But this was different. Witnessing to one's faith is not the same as talking about Christianity in general terms. To prepare for the other talks, I studied. Before giving my testimony, I prayed.

How could I express before strangers why I, a Catholic laywoman, had chosen to spend my life in clunky and often syncopated service to the church? How could I describe the Lord I was following and the particulars of our private bargain? Is it even possible to tell the story of one's own faith journey without it sounding pretty ridiculous out loud? How to recover one's dignity after sharing the intimate details of falling in love and giving oneself away with reckless abandon?


In more than 20-odd years of working in and around the church, I had learned not to ask a priest about his spiritual life unless he volunteered the information. Such queries most often led to a moment of discomfort, as if I'd asked a married couple to talk about their sexual relationship. Some matters are better left unspoken outside of the parties involved. In Catholic circles, the faith journey can seem like one of those matters.

In the end, in front of the Presbyterian congregation, I spoke about the day on which I first clearly perceived my vocation. It was an extraordinary hour of grace and joy that I have held onto through all the decades that followed. Such clarity has not accompanied me every step of choices—"unequally the way since, I must admit, but the memory of that time is so precise and powerful that it supports me even now. That one hour explains everything there is to know about why I was standing before a crowd on this recent weekend and talking about God, instead of the million other possibilities I had for my life.

Follow me

all is a loaded word in Catholic conversations. It is often used narrowly in reference to the specifically celibate summons to priesthood or religious life. Only occasionally do I hear laypeople discuss the work they do in terms of call, and almost never have I heard a married person speak of his or her marriage in those terms. And yet marriage is one of the two sacraments of vocation to which many are summoned by forces as mysterious and compelling as any other, and it is the source of every other blessing in the church.

In a profound sense, however, Baptism is the ultimate sacrament of vocation, for it is under this sign that we acknowledge



The stories of call appear throughout the Bible as if to demonstrate for us how it's done. Abram finds his call revealed to him in a starry sky. Moses is startled to recognize his in a burning bush. Ruth experiences her summons through the love she bears for her mother-in-law. Elisha has a cloak thrown across his shoulders and understands at once that something incredible is being asked of him. One thing is for sure: When the call comes, however it comes, it is immediate, allconsuming, and life changing.

Don't look back

lisha was unusually fortunate to be given even a few hours to say his good-byes to his family and to provide for them one last time. He didn't know what the summons would entail or where the journey would take him. All he knew was the identity of the one who called him. Evidently that was enough: He followed Elijah meekly into the pages of scripture and became known as the prophet with

In other words, the AMS is responsible for the pastoral care of men, women, and children from all U.S. dioceses, who hail from all 50 States and *U.S. Territories - including* members of our own parish! The AMS receives no funding from the U.S. Government and must rely principally on private donations to fund an annual operating budget of over \$8.2 million. 

double the portion of his mentor's authority.

Saint Paul describes the call of Christ as a summons out of slavery and into freedom. The worst thing we can do after receiving this freedom is to refuse to use it or, conversely, to squander it. It would be like receiving a double portion of grace and using it up in front of the TV. What constellations of possibility are open to us in the Spirit and how little we make of these opportunities!

In this sense, the Samaritans we hear about in the gospel are better off than the average mediocre disciple of Jesus. The Samaritans simply waved Jesus away and would not receive him in their village, period. How much worse for us if we welcome Jesus into our lives and then, dismissively, act as if he were not our guest.

When Jesus issues the call to discipleship, he admits

no qualifications to that invitation. We do not get insurance with this or anything like the prenuptial agreement that effectively nullifies the trust in a marriage. He calls; we go. Or else we, too, should wave him away and tell him, like the Samaritans did, that his destination is not pleasing to us.

Giving our testimony

Then we say yes to Jesus and fall in behind him on the way, we are as much in the dark as Elisha about what we have just done. Ignorance may well be bliss in this regard: We might suffer from "too much information" if it were otherwise. Knowing the one we follow is more important than knowing where the road will lead. He is the one with living water and abundant bread, the healer, teacher, savior, and friend. He is the only one who knows the way through death to new life. What are we waiting for?
