Words to Die For

rorture, mutilation, and ing a piece of meat. Soverexecution are subjects most of us would prefer to avoid. Because we tend to stick to noble ideals in church-unconditional love, justice, peace, charity, morality, forgiveness-it is especially jarring to find a reading like this one from tells the Thessalonians to Maccabees assigned a public hearing. Though we live in a world where horrors exist, many of us might choose to keep these difficult facts out of the sanctuary. Isn't that the meaning of the term "sanctuary": a place where the danger of culpability can't touch us?

But the word of God rushes in to fill every available space in our world, just as it did when creating each molecule to begin with. And if ever there's a space crying out for a living word to speak into it, it's the place where innocence suffers and dies at the hands of humanly orchestrated evil. The story of the seven Hebrew martyrs in Maccabees is a tale of villainous outrage visited upon witnesses to integrity in the sight of heaven and earth. The horrendous details are hard to bear even in the telling some 21 centuries later.

Yet the purpose of the story is to contain the vital purity of these young men's heroic testimony: that God's will is a higher authority than government, and heaven's promises are more to be desired than mortal life itself. To these martyrs, it was clearly more than a matter of eateignty was the issue: Which power is ultimately to be revered, the human or the divine?

A word bearing glory

Daul frames the idea in terms of glory when he be encouraged in every good word and deed. God's holy word is "glorified" among those who keep the faith. Are there perverse and wicked doings about? Without question. What is the best way to hang onto hope and be preserved from the evil one in such a context? Stay close to the instructive, enduring, guiding word.

But we misunderstand the word of God if we think nailing the Ten Commandments to the wall of every classroom and public building will do the trick. A word chiseled in stone is a dead word. A memorized list of chapters and verses or a Bible on every Christian coffee table isn't going to save us. God's word is alive, and a living word has to pierce the heart and become embedded in our flesh. If Jesus' own example is any indication, a glorified word is first of all a vulnerable one, capable of passion and willing to accept it for the sake of testifying to the truth.

Playing with matches

ven pagan religions acknowledged fire as a gift of the gods and knew enough not to be careless with such a powerful vehicle of divine will. But the



Sadducees seem quite willing to play with fire when they start their juggling act with the law of Moses in the presence of Jesus. Their hope is that he will be consumed by the conflagration of an unpopular answer. First, they toss Levirate law into the air: Every man must have his descendants, even if it takes a surviving male relative to father them. Next they add the story of seven brothers dying without heirs (awkwardly paired with the seven martyrs' reading in the religious imagination of the lectionary organizers). The final element of their act is the teaching on the resurrection, something Sadducees have gone on record as denouncing. This is what ignites the game and what they hope will lead to Jesus' credibility going up in flames. Little do they realize that their own authority has just caught on fire unawares.

Levirate law was too unpopular to touch—just read any story from Hebrew scripture about how reluctant men were to spend time with their dead relative's wives. Such unions even seemed to acquire the aura of a fatal attraction, as in the story of Tamar in Genesis or Sarah in Tobit. Jesus, for his part, sidesteps the issue totally when he dismisses marriage as a temporal reality that has no corollary in the world to come. But then he pushes through the same door the Sadducees unwittingly opened and moves into a teaching

on the nature of angelic spirits and rising from the dead, subjects the religious leaders find abhorrent.

No wonder the scribes who were present declared, "Teacher, you have answered well." And the rest of the leaders don't dare to pose another question.

Serious words

hy did the Sadducees wind up standing there before Jesus like the covote in the Warner Bros. cartoon, burned to a crisp by their own devices? Because they underestimated the power of the divine word to achieve its end, which is the proclamation of the truth. As preachers, we dare not make that same mistake. The word of God is not a game to be played in order to win at some agenda. This holy and powerful word is the force behind creation, made flesh in the person of Jesus, rendered

as testimony by martyrs, and continues to speak truth to power in every age. If we use it for any other reason-to score points in an argument, to control people, to consolidate our authority, or to intimidate and shamethen we are no better than the devil who used scripture to similar ends once in a desert conversation with Jesus. And we will prove to be as successful as the Sadducees at that game, left holding the match as they smolder in disbelief.

Does this make us feel cautious? I hope so. Perhaps the safest employment of the word is to allow it to speak into our lives and to stay humbly behind it like Saint Paul, who only testified to his experience and never to what he had not already lived.
