Apocalypse (any day) Now

s it me, or is it the times? Apocalyptic writings used to seem so surreal and unbelievable that those parts of the Bible say, Revelation, Daniel, Ezekiel, Malachi, and snippets of Paul and the gospels—just didn't have a hearing in me. I dismissed those passages as morbid and fantastic, products of an age that didn't have its act together and could only envision release from its chaos in terms of total annihilation. Well, guess what: These days, apocalyptic literature has the whole world sitting up and paying attention. It's starting to make sense and sound unhappily familiar. Lately, we begin to suspect those times are ours, and that vision is not so outrageous after all.

Apocalyptic feeling is the sort of thing that comes around every few generations. Human history is remarkably messy, and depending on when and where you are born, your window on the world may make John of Patmos sound like a man of understatement. It's no accident that both Hebrew and Christian scripture end with apocalypse. Malachi is the proper end of the Hebrew scroll, and the last line of the prophecy was originally "Lest I come and strike the land with doom" in verse 24. "Doom" being such a pessimistic note on which to end, the rabbis went back and repeated verse 23 as a coda: "Lo, I will send you Elijah, the

prophet, Before the day of the Lord comes, the great and terrible day." This is supposed to be more comforting. Whether or not we hear it that way, of course, depends on where in the theater of history we are sitting.

Malachi's problem

he prophecies of Malachi, literally "my messenger," are from the postexilic period, when the temple is already rebuilt and running. But things are not as good as such circumstances might imply. Unsurprisingly, starting over after the return from Babylon led to complications: what to do with the reality of foreign wives and their idolatrous ways, and how to deal with careless liturgical practices at the temple. Nearcontemporary prophets like

Haggai and Zechariah were more optimistic about the They believed that a refurbished temple and new leadership were signs that a bright new day for Israel was dawning. Their prophecies reflect an enthusiasm for the future that Malachi no longer shares.

What went wrong? The hoped-for reign of Zerubbabel most predominantly. Back in the time of the exile, Jeremiah prophesied that the royal house of Israel, then led by one Jehoiachin, was through. God snatched the messianic line of kings from the royal hand like a signet ring and tossed it into the dust bowl

of history. No heir of Jehoiachin would ever sit on the throne in Israel. But after the exile, Haggai exuberantly disagreed, calling Jehoiachin's grandson Zerubbabel a new signet ring that would rule with God's full blessing. Zechariah seconded the motion with a coronation prophecy, and even Ezekiel anticipated such a time. But the name of Zerubbabel was later expunged from the text and replaced with the name of the man who would actually ascend to leadership, Joshua his assistant. The sequence of events is unclear, and it could be that foreign powers intervened before the line of David could be reestablished. But the prophecy of a return to the era of the messiah-king was not fulfilled. This plunged the nation and its current prophet into a mood of fatalism. God was obviously not going to be moved on this score, and without the blessed house of David in charge, catanation making a comeback. clysm seemed like the best way out of the cul-de-sac of history in which they were marooned.

Fast-forward to Jerusalem A.D.

ive centuries after the exile, the hope of the nation was invested in the Jerusalem temple. The throne of David seemed irretrievably lost to history, and puppet kings like the Herodians were a national joke. The temple was the center of divine authority, not to mention the last stand of national identity, and if God were ever going to rescue the nation from

its oppressors and reestablish the messiah-king of Israel, it would be from this spot, Mount Zion.

Imagine then in this context hearing the words of Jesus dismissing the temple like a pile of stones easily thrown down! If even the temple should not be viewed as the fortress of God's presence and the emblem of Israel's future, then where might one look for such things? It was no use to explain that the house of David had at last arrived to claim its kingship; that the presence of God could not come more fully into their midst than where it stood right now; that the hour they were waiting for was this one. Jesus had been proclaiming the Kingdom for some years now. Those who had ears had already heard. and those who didn't. wouldn't.

The arrival of Jesus in Jerusalem was the apocalypse, "the great and terrible day," come blazing like an oven to reduce evildoers to stubble. For others it was the arrival of the son

of justice with healing in its rays. Once again, our seat in the theater of history affects which reality is coming our way.


Do the kings and the temples matter?

bviously, the time to trust in the citadels of worldly power is past. Heaven knows we still need to vote, affiliate with a church and creed, make a living and not a nuisance of ourselves, consider carefully and critically the wars and cataclysms of our time. The world still engages us mightily, and we should responsibly return the favor. But we must not be deceived in these endeavors that the goal of our efforts is in this vortex of messy history. All that we see here—a day will come when it will all be thrown down. No king can promise us safety, and no temple can guarantee our righteousness. 
