The Age of Apocalypse

hate to admit that I grew up amid the "dawning of the age of Aquarius," or so the contemporary musical Hair assured me at the time. It was reported to be an age of "Harmony and understanding, sympathy and trust abounding/No more falsehoods or divisions, golden living dreams of vision/Mystic crystal revelations and the mind's true liberation," etc. Sounded pretty good at the time, even if you were pursuing a route that was not pharmaceutically enhanced.

A lot of folks in that generation, and indeed in every generation, hold ideals of progress or freedom or emerging truth that seem justified while we are young, but become increasingly dubious as we grow older. The glowing sense that life is getting better with the advance of technology—or the increase in knowledge, the end of the Cold War, the decoding of DNA, you name it—tends to dim as we live long enough to realize that the world really can't get better until human nature gets better. That advance seems long in coming.

At the end of the last millennium, magazine writers waxed eloquent on the subiect of what this millennium would bring. Some feared the collapse of civilization as we know it—or at least the collapse of our computers—but most visionaries preferred to idealize the advancements in medicine, world peace,

global prosperity, and personal convenience that seemed right around the corner. It sure did start to sound like Aquarius was dawning again, for a moment. But by then, old world horrors caught up with us, and history felt like a looped videotape once more.

A time of unsurpassed distress

ou can't really organize a list of catastrophes in terms of their relative significance, because we all live in different proximity to the events we are prioritizing. Some people report that the most shocking thing to happen in their lifetime was the assassination of John F. Kennedv. For others, the death of Bobby Kennedy or Martin Luther King was more chilling. The present generation of children may well point to the morning of 9/11 in 2001; though certainly for some, what happened in Oklahoma City or Columbine High had a more immediately devastating impact. And for those in other countries, acts of war, terrorism, famine, or disease may take center stage in the compiling of catastrophes. For any of us, the personal loss of a parent, spouse, or child could make world events fade into irrelevancy by comparison.

Is the world indeed getting better, or worse, or is it the same place it's always been? When we read apocalyptic passages in the Bi-

ble, we may suspect that shocking and showstopping terror has long been a part of the human story. Some of it was easily attributable to your neighbor or your enemy, but a portion of it was understood to bear the divine signature in what we refer to now as "acts of God." These storms, plagues, earthquakes, and famines were God's way of telling us to wise up or pay attention. Once, God even tried wiping the slate of humanity clean with a flood, but that experiment was so ruthlessly destructive, God repented it and promised not to do it again.

Apocalypse didn't lose its appeal, however. In fact, as biblical history rolled on, the writings became increasingly apocalyptic. Many of the prophets appealed to such images to underscore their messages. Jesus and Paul were no strangers to the impact of this kind of language. The last book of the Bible, Revelation, is nothing but crashing, nonstop destruction of the sort you generally expect to find in Hollywood action films or horror movies.

This stuff is scary

That are we supposed to make of end-time visions and nightmarish prophecies of devastation today? Believe it or not, these writings were originally considered to be comfort food for the faithful. No matter that the sun gets

darkened and the stars fall from the sky (and don't try to do the science here): The point Jesus makes is that glory is riding in on the wings of the eschaton. The lesson to be learned is not that God is peeved and heads are going to roll, but rather that, at the worst moment of history imaginable, Jesus "is near, at the gates."

The lesson as Jesus offers it could not be gentler: Look at the branches of the **brightly** fig tree and note how the tender greenness means that summer is coming. Summer, not winter! The "day of the Lord," often described as a "great and terrible day," is also the day of hope for all who put their trust in God. Apocalyptic literature may seem scary and does contain its share of monsters. But the last word on the subject of the world is always that God will save us from death, from destruction, from the devil, from ourselves.

If we do the Book of Revelation by the numbers, which its emphasis on numerology recommends we do, we see that only a rem-

nant of the people is destroyed in the apocalypseto-end-all-apocalypses. This is a departure from the rest of salvation history, in which a remnant is usually all that's saved. Meanwhile, throughout the book, while the world is being systematically besieged, the heavenly liturgy continues in song and triumph. There is never any doubt that a new day is about to dawn, and things are looking up.

The wise shall shine brightly

he writers of fairy tales and children's stories know that going through perils and hardship doesn't mean the story will end unhappily. We might keep this in mind as we move through our present swatch of history, wondering if we will ever have reason to feel secure again. The faithful are always safe, resting in the hand of God like a weaned child on its mother's breast. The dangers are real, and the suffering does hurt. But God writes the final chapter, and our faith guarantees that it's good.

By making a gift of your appreciated securities, you can avoid paying capital gains tax that would otherwise be due if you sold these assets. Contributions are deductible for tax purposes. There are no transaction fees or other costs and the full value of the sold securities benefits the parish, school or other Catholic charity you select.

More importantly, the question you may want to consider is this: Have I been blessed with many gifts and am I inspired by Gospel teaching and my Catholic values that charitable giving is a profound and joy-inspiring expression of love and gratitude? How can I live out my Catholic values and put them into action for the greater good of the community? Your stock contribution will help you live out your Catholic values and benefit your parish or school at the same time.

IRA Required Minimum **Distributions**

s scripture reads, "Jesus said, Give and it will be given to you...For the measure you give will be in turn, the measure that you get back." After years of contributing to tax -deferred IRAs and 401(k)s, income tax is due on that money when a person withdraws it in retirement. Annual withdraws from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70½. But, IRA owners that are 70½ or older may make charitable contributions of up to \$100,000 per year directly to an eligible charity (e.g., Catholic Parish, School, Foundation, etc.) without paying income tax on the transaction. If you file a joint return, your spouse may also make a charitable contribution of up to \$100,000, meaning couples can exclude up to \$200,000 of their retirement savings from income tax if they donate it to a charity. Qualified charitable contributions must be made by December 31 each year in order to exclude that

Charitable contributions can only be made from IRAs, not 401(k)s or similar types of retirement accounts. Donors might need to roll funds over from a 401(k) to an IRA if they want to make tax-free charitable contributions part of their retirement plan. A donor doesn't need to itemize their taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution. Donors

should consult with their personal tax advisors on the donations and the tax implications. Donors may make these donations directly to the parish, school or ministry of their choice or they may make it through the Diocese of San Diego at no additional cost. 


