### Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

#### Mass Readings:

Ez 34:11-12, 15-17 1 Cor 15:20-26, 28 Mt 25:31-46

**GROW:** Today, we acknowledge and celebrate Christ the King. It's hard to put this royal image together with today's Gospel passage, where Jesus is not asking to be treated like a king, but rather instructing us to perform merciful deeds for the least of his brothers and sisters. Yet it is the perfect followon to the previous three Sundays' Scriptures, where Jesus tells us what it means to live a life of holiness, preparation, and faithful investment in the Kingdom. Now we see what awaits those of us who turn over our lives to him, seeing the face of Jesus in the least among us - the poor, the imprisoned, the thirsty, the stranger. "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."

**GO:** I confess that judgment day readings scare me a little. Some days I



behave more like a "goat" than a "sheep." Side note: After a deep dive into the Internet (did you know that sheep have 54 chromosomes and goats have

Jesus isn't talking about farm animals here. He's talking about us humans and the choices we make or don't make through sins of omission. The list seems endless if I focus on all the things I could be doing to help others each and every day. Yet, rather than getting caught up in fear or guilt, today's readings encourage me, and remind me, that Jesus has told us what we need to do to be counted as "sheep" on the last day.

60?), I've concluded that

**ACTIONS:** Choose one corporal work of mercy today and act on it. What does it look like to "visit the sick"? Donate blood; make food for someone who isn't feeling well; check in on an elderly neighbor.

Do you know some "sheep" – people who radiate faith and kindness to others? Just as you might network with a professional in your field, invite that person out for coffee. Ask them about their faith and how it inspires them in their daily lives.

#### What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Dold ritual that falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In a particular way, pray-



er before the Blessed Sacrament – exposed in a monstrance or not – is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass. In a long-standing practice, a period of adoration before the exposed Blessed Sacrament often ends with "benediction",

the blessing of the faithful by Jesus himself



Not a few religious communities and parishes throughout the United States have introduced the practice of perpetual Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, while most other faith communities have the custom of shorter periods of Exposition. Care should always be taken that these periods of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament respect the instruction outlined in Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, the liturgical book

that gives the instructions for the proper celebration of Exposition and the fundamental connection these Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.


Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist enshrined in the tabernacle or when it is exposed in the monstrance (both are equally valid, as the Christ is not more present in one than the other).
