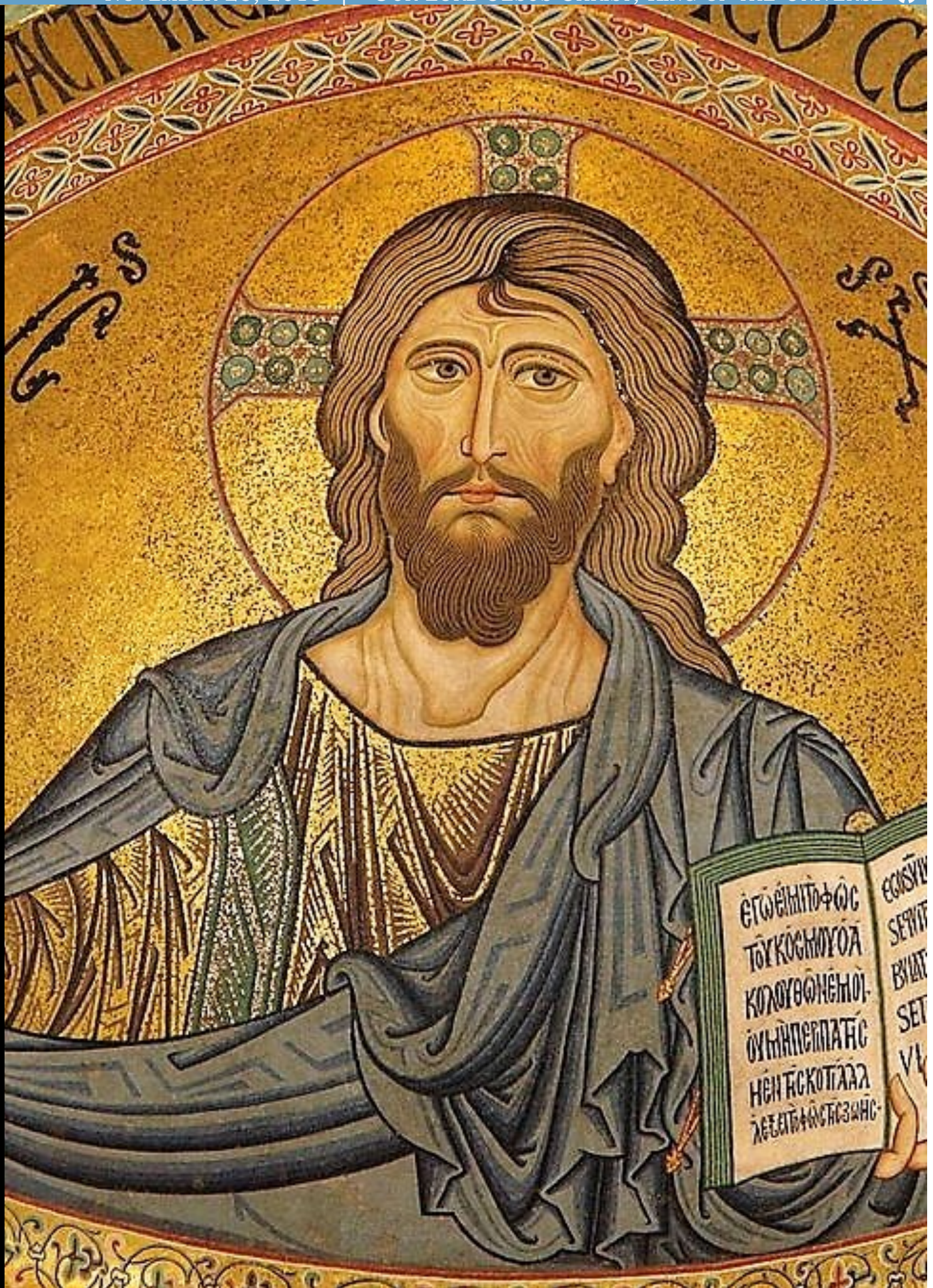

Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

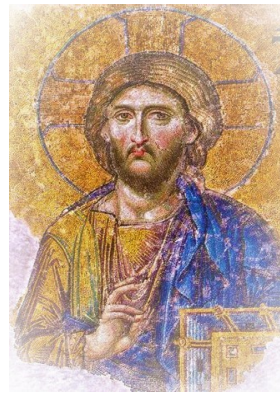

### The Kingdom of the Long Haul

**S**hould our politicians be constrained in their access to the seats of power? Few Americans would vote for a return to monarchy, and most of us are content to “throw the bum out” after a few years—even if we voted that person into office to begin with. That natural skepticism seems part of the American way when it comes to being led. We pride ourselves, if somewhat naively, on being a classless society. We want to believe that all folks are created equal, even if we are less likely to treat them that way. Most of all, we don’t accept the notion of an elite, or the idea that someone deserves authority over us indefinitely. We have imbibed the secular gospel that “power tends to corrupt,” as Lord Acton put it nearly two centuries ago, “and absolute power corrupts absolutely.” He added, “Great men are almost always bad men.”

Perhaps our knowledge of our own imperfect nature convinces us that human beings cannot be trusted with unchallenged authority. This explains our caution about Big Government, our suspicion of anything that smacks of a rollback of our rights, and our insistence on the sanctity of everything that falls under the category of “our privacy.” We likewise want to have some say in who gets to be the mayor, how long the

representative represents us, and what it takes to impeach a sitting president. The American psyche rebels against the idea of being pinned under a rule or a ruler without an escape hatch.

#### Pilate questions authority

**B**ecause of our own reluctant relationship with being ruled too long or too far, we understand the position of Pontius Pilate when faced with the dilemma concerning the Nazarene. Most depictions of Pilate are sympathetic; he seems like a guy who’s just doing his job. He didn’t go trawling the streets of Jerusalem looking for miscreants, at least not in the gospel portraits of him. The Jewish authorities brought Jesus to him and insisted he do something about this blasphemer. But Pilate didn’t dabble in local pieties. So they rephrased the situation: Jesus was setting up a rival authority to Rome, and if Pilate didn’t respond judiciously, he was “no friend of Caesar” either.

That woke Pilate up. He was an irrelevant governor of a notoriously restless region. Judea was the backwater of the empire, and if Pilate couldn’t control that, his career was finished. So he turned the question to Jesus immediately: “Are you the King of the Jews?” It was the sort of yes-or-no matter that could be speedily resolved.

Except that Jesus famously didn’t answer those kinds of questions with that kind of an answer.

Instead, Jesus returned the volley with his own query about power, asking in effect, “By whose authority do you ask about me?”

Disgusted by the accusation that he might be in cahoots with the religious leaders of Israel whom he did not respect, Pilate spoke for himself when he asked what appears to be a more honest question: “What have you done?” Unfortunately for Pilate, Jesus didn’t answer this question either. He simply reverted to the original matter of kingship and said his reign is not here.

#### The king of elsewhere

**P**ilate latches onto this admission to some rival claim on authority. “Then you are a king?” He proceeds more cautiously this time, leaving the Jews out of the equation, hoping to discover what precisely Jesus stands for—or against. Jesus responds by reiterating Pilate’s question as a statement, but then as before, the reply spins out of Pilate’s control, or at least his comprehension. He does not understand that the authority of Jesus is in the truth, for his claim is to be the Truth, not to mention the Way and the Life. If Pilate wants to dis-

cuss power with Jesus, he's going to have to step up to a higher order of reality than mere politics.

Well, even though our scripture portion today doesn't go any farther, we know what Pilate does with this invitation to consider the root and source of power itself. He sniffs at it like a dog at a curious but doubtful morsel on the ground. "What is truth?" he replies coolly and doesn't linger to hear a reply.

Too bad for Pilate that he doesn't care about what's behind the world's façade of power. Too bad he didn't ask Jesus, "What is truth?" with a genuine concern for the answer. The response might have transformed him. It could literally have saved him. But instead, he settled for simply saving his seat.

We, too, can save our seats in the pecking order, hang onto tendrils of power over family members, friends, employees, or coworkers, make people dance to our tune and insist that our agenda come to pass. We can get what Pilate got, and enjoy it while it lasts.

Or we can aim higher and

hope for far more.

### Alpha, omega, and everything in between

If we believe in the words of Jesus—and that's the biggest *if* we'll ever be confronted with—then all power over our lives belongs to him and his reign, which has no end. This is a long term by any standard and "absolute power" in the infinite sense. No term limits and no territorial boundaries mean nothing on earth can challenge the authority of Jesus. And if we find ourselves bowing our heads to another king or tipping our hats to a different Lord, we might ask ourselves why. Certainly we sympathize with Pilate for clutching the tatters of worldly power and not letting go when faced with something exponentially greater. The King of Elsewhere is a curious Lord to follow, and putting our faith in him in no way implies that the powers of this world won't have at us—as a glance at the cross soberly reminds us. Yet his testimony is truth, and his is the only authority that lasts.

**IRA Required Minimum Distributions**

**A**s scripture reads, "Jesus said, Give and it will be given to you...For the measure you give will be in turn, the measure that you get back." After years of contributing to tax-deferred IRAs and 401(k)s, income tax is due on that money when a person withdraws it in retirement. Annual withdrawals from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70½. But, IRA owners that are 70½ or older may make charitable contributions of up to \$100,000 per

year directly to an eligible charity (e.g., Catholic Parish, School, Foundation, etc.) without paying income tax on the transaction. If you file a joint return, your spouse may also make a charitable contribution of up to \$100,000, meaning couples can exclude up to \$200,000 of their retirement savings from income tax if they donate it to a charity. Qualified charitable contributions must be made by December 31 each year in order to exclude that amount from income.

Charitable contributions can only be made from IRAs, not 401(k)s or similar types of retirement accounts. Donors might need

to roll funds over from a 401(k) to an IRA if they want to make tax-free charitable contributions part of their retirement plan. A donor doesn't need to itemize their taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution. Donors should consult with their personal tax advisors on the donations and the tax implications. Donors may make these donations directly to the parish, school or ministry of their choice or they may make it through the Diocese of San Diego at no additional cost. 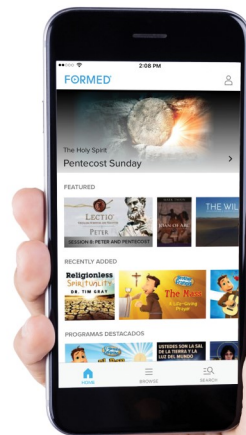
