Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

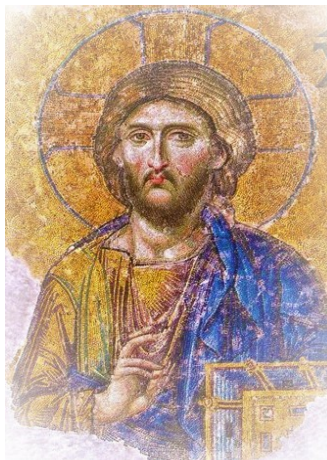

The Now of Salvation

How can you not like Zacchaeus? He's such a classic nerdy guy, pathetically outcast in nearly every way possible. He's a member of a despised profession, doubly hated for being so rich at everyone else's expense. And he lacks such personal gravitas that he, an adult, is willing to shinny up a tree to get an eyeful of a passing celebrity. Most of all, let's face it, the guy is, in our politically correct lingo, "vertically challenged." He is, to put it bluntly, haplessly short. That's been a handicap in every age, even before the advent of basketball. And psychologists warn that it can lead to a personality that is rabidly overreaching. Just ask Napoleon.

We imagine Zacchaeus with his shirttail hanging out, wearing plaid high-water pants, looking for all the world like Rick Moranis in *Ghostbusters*. He probably has a high, nasal voice set at a perpetual whine. He wears a toupee that has often gone awry. If he has a wife, she's a gold digger. If he has friends, he bought them at a party shop and they're made out of cardboard.

Zacchaeus is described as a chief tax collector, which is about as low as you could go in the popular esteem of first-century Jericho citizenry. And the moral value of his profession began in the basement as it was. When mentioned in the New Testament, tax

collectors are usually paired in the same sentence with "sinners," "prostitutes," or "Gentiles." Any way you look at it, nobody's mothers wanted their babies to grow up to be tax collectors.

Saved by a sycamore

Jesus didn't come to Jericho to teach. Scripture says he was just passing through on his way to somewhere else. Zacchaeus wanted to see him—not to follow him or even to hear him but just to ogle him, as far as we are told. But the coming of the renowned and controversial teacher had created a throng on the streets in the way a rock star's motorcade might cause excitement today. The windows of the car may be tinted and you really can't see a thing, but you want to tell your friends that you were there and you saw *something*—a fleeting glimpse of immortality, if nothing more. So Zacchaeus was intent on getting head and shoulders above the rest to steal a glance at greatness. Even if it meant climbing into a tree and making a spectacle of himself in the process. Perhaps it never occurred to this businessman, panting from the exertion of running ahead and clamoring up to his special spot, that Jesus might look up. Zacchaeus was perched up there to see, but not necessarily to be seen. It may not have crossed his mind what it

could mean to become visible—and vulnerable—to the power of holiness.

But this is how miracles always take place: suddenly, unexpectedly, blessedly, and undeservedly. Before Jesus had finished saying, "Today I must stay at your house," Zacchaeus all but fell out of the tree and landed at his feet. The advance word had been that Jesus was just passing through, but for some reason having to do with this uncanny exchange of looks, Jesus had decided to stay. With him of all people!

The Kingdom doesn't wait

A lot of things happen at once: the criticism of the crowds, naturally, at top volume. Sure, Jesus is staying at the best house in town—with that sinner. That changed a lot of people's minds regarding what Jesus was about. But at the same time, in a lower voice, Zacchaeus is making his confession and pledging half his wealth to alms and with the rest, to make restitution four times over for his offenses. Did Zacchaeus even know it was in his heart to speak such words? The power of Jesus' presence has been known to transform many of us beyond our wildest imagination or wishes.

And if popular criticism doesn't miss a beat and Zacchaeus' transformation doesn't waste any time, neither does the coming of the Kingdom as it rushes

in to fill the human heart that makes room for it. Salvation comes to Zacchaeus today because Kingdom time is always present, immediate, and satisfying, the very definition of "fulfillment." Jesus comes to stay with him "today" because salvation belongs neither to the past nor the future but is a

constantly available reality that enters and empowers our lives in the only living moment there is, the one inhabited by will and decision, right now. The Kingdom came to Zacchaeus as a "now or never" proposition—which is precisely how it comes to us today. Whether we're up a tree or not.
