"Increase Our Faith"

he apostles ask Jesus for a favor that seems pious and fitting. Jesus has been exhorting them with teachings about what is expected of disciples the renunciation of material wealth, unconditional forgiveness, mindfulness of the poor—and we can imagine these demands weigh worked in the vineyard. heavily on those still quite attached to the world and its value system. So they make a request for more faith to help them embrace these obligations. We can almost hear Jesus laughing.

More faith? he says. What would you do with more faith than you are already doing with the faith you have? Faith, like love, like commitment, like pregnancy, is a you-are-or-you'renot proposition. If you surrender to love, it will envelope you unbidden. If you sincere heart, you will learn how to be committed. If you are a little bit pregnant, the rest of the pregnancy will follow naturally. And if you believe, one act of faith is enough to uproot a tree and transplant it into the sea. If you don't believe, don't even bother to attempt this transaction.

Human beings tend to default to the assumption that more is better. The urge is called concupiscence, the sin of desire. and it's the best name for original sin because every sin originates with the yearning for more. But virtues aren't gathered like

worldly wealth. They aren't measured in terms of quantity. A deathbed conversion saves as well as a lifelong pursuit of holiness. We may balk at the unfairness of this system, but talk to the One handing out the same wage at the end of the day to all who When it's your vineyard, you get to make the rules.

Be still and know who you are

esus points out that identifying the players in this dynamic may assist understanding. The one in charge gets served, and the servant does what he or she is obliged to do. This may smack of the sort of class structure that U.S. culture instinctively rejects, but here it becomes not a metaphor for oppression and inequality, but make a commitment with a rather liberation and promise. When we have faith of the mustard seed variety, we can trust that great things will be accomplished precisely because the power does not depend on us. God is the one who has to come up with the spiritual authority: Our job is only to believe. Being the servant should be a relief to us, not a burden. If the saints had sat around wondering how to cure a leper, or produce stigmata, it would have been a profound waste of time. It wasn't in them to do; it was up to God to provide. You and I don't have to worry about doing the part of the master, only that of the servant. Far from being an op-



pressive idea, that should bring us confidence.

Power and love and selfcontrol

n the pastoral letter to Timothy, a church leader is reminded that the flame of the Spirit is already given to the church. We don't have to wait on anything to make us more prepared to do what God calls us to do in this world. The power is available, the love is within us, and selfcontrol is the discipline that guards and guides its progress. But it's important to recall that self-control is a fruit of the Spirit, not an exercise of our puny wills. (Ask the Twelve Step crowd how "Higher Power" works.) These attributes are gifts from God sitting on our doorstep ready for action. All that remains is for us to plant our seed of faith into the soil of the world and begin the cycle of growth and new life.

One seed is all we're given. And one seed is enough. But any gardener knows that a seed that is not planted will not produce anything. That's why the church encourages us to make an act of faith, a choice for faith, a deliberate bow of the will to God. After that, you might want to duck. Flying trees can be a hazard, and you never know where they'll end up.






