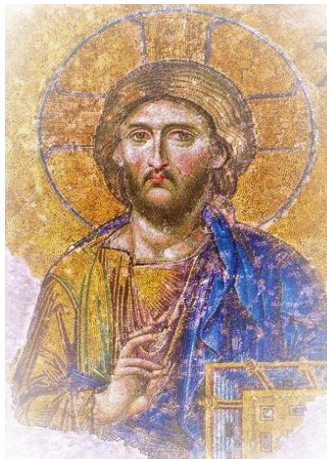

Thank-you is a Way of Life

How can any of us adequately say thanks for all that we've been given? We'd have to begin with the mother-of-all-thank-yous to God that we are here at all, that *here* is here, that creation was ever called into being. We could list the particulars of our incarnation: our health and ability, talents and personal characteristics that have enabled us to make our way in the world. And we'd express gratitude to the family members who were there for us and created an environment through which we could mature. Our litany of thanksgiving would include teachers and mentors and supportive friends, all those who along the way gave us encouragement, understanding, acceptance, and companionship. We'd give thanks for love in our lives; for the great gift of children, ours or others; for art, beauty, story, and inspiration. We might be moved to offer thanks for the faith we've inherited or discovered for ourselves; for the country we live in and the freedoms we enjoy; for second chances, for the grace to change, for moments of play and rest; and for the joy we receive without paying or deserving.

All of this comes to us without lifting a finger or proving ourselves. The worst creep in the neighborhood gets all the same opportunities for happiness and all the same reasons to hope. When we stop to make lists of what we have to be grateful for, we realize it would take a lifetime to say thanks for everything and everybody. We can

start right now with line items—thanks for that rock, that tree, that flower, that color—or we can forget the inventory and just live every hour gratefully.

Much to be grateful for

Sometimes, astounding things come our way that would make even Scrooge say thank-you. Take the healing of Naaman, the general of Aram who was also a leper. Leprosy meant many things in the ancient world—psoriasis and eczema, sores and rashes and blisters and cancers. Rarely did it imply Hansen's disease, but it always made you shunned in public places. It also made you miserable and lonely, and caused physical suffering. Leprosy, by any other name, was a nightmare.

And how is Naaman relieved of this condition? As a by-product of his own sin, no less. On a raid in Israel, he kidnapped a little girl and gave her to his wife for a maid, no doubt as a way to stay in his wife's good graces because his presence must have been unwelcome. The child, far from loathing her new master with the appalling appearance, is moved to pity him. She tells her mistress about a prophet who works cures for God. It will require a journey back to the foreign land recently plundered and surrendering to the power of the enemy's God. We can imagine Naaman's reluctance to go this route, even to achieve his own liberation.

Naaman goes to Israel and

nearly passes up the chance to wash himself clean of his disease because of his pride. But despite his lack of faith and great unworthiness, the healing takes effect. No wonder he wants two mule-loads of Hebrew earth to take home with him!

Nine out of 10 are not grateful

Jesus cures 10 lepers, and it's the lone Samaritan who makes his way back to say thanks, the one least expected to do the right thing in Jewish society. It doesn't take much imagination to guess what happened to the other nine. Some didn't ascribe the healing to Jesus at all but credited it to their own prayers or righteousness. Some were bitter about how long it took God to get around to healing them and didn't feel especially grateful about having been leprous to begin with. Some were so far out of the habit of gratitude that it never occurred to them to say thank you. Others were simply so delighted by the gift that it drove all thoughts of the giver from their minds.

We all have friends and relatives who fail to say thanks when we remember their birthdays, send money, invite them to dinner, or give them our time and presence. A gift is freely given, and the expression of gratitude is not technically required. But it is the natural response of those who fully appreciate what's been done for them. In the case of the lepers, gratitude is the first sign that the healing went all the way through.

Glorifying God in a loud voice

"Thanks for a wonderful day," my friend Dale used to say every night after one of his friends helped him into bed. Dale was dying of cancer and dependent on others for nearly every aspect of his care. But his last words each night were about gratitude for what he did have. He called each day "wonderful," which seemed appalling at first to those of us who saw his suffering. But they were indeed wonderful days, and Dale helped us all to see them that way.

What is clear in the study of gratitude is that it gradually becomes a way of life for those who practice it, no longer tied to the particulars of what we receive or how we're treated. If Francis of Assisi could find "perfect

joy" after experiencing rejection and deprivation, then we can experience gratitude whether the miracle healing comes on cue or not. The common excuse of those who are habitually ungrateful is that they don't "feel" thankful—that is, they don't experience their lives as a blessing, their histories as favorable, their relationships as nurturing, or their means sufficient. They misconceive gratitude as payment for services rendered, just as we often insist upon thanks for gifts we freely bestow. In the end, gratitude may well be a lens through which we see the world around us more accurately. If we adopt the practice of gratitude, we may discover much to be grateful for.
