s it a sin to be rich? We might well ask the question. So much of the gospel teaching seems to focus on the perils of acquiring wealth. The parable of Dives and Lazarus, as well as the man counting on his abundant storage in the barn, gives us a sense that the rich are damned, the poor blessed. After all, isn't that what it says in the Beatitudes: "Blessed are the poor, they get the Kingdom"? Jesus warns his disciples not to take a purse or extra cloak with them on the mission trails, and to accept whatever hospitality is offered, like beggars for the sake of the gospel. There is such a strong emphasis on the apparent virtue of poverty in these stories, it certainly sounds like owning stuff is a minor infraction, if not a major miscalculation. The widow with her surrendered mite is certainly more of a hero than the rich man who wants to inherit eternal life—on top of everything else he's already inherited, apparently. Acquiring wealth is obviously a really bad idea according to Jesus. After all, his stash was in heaven, and he walked around Israel without a pillow for his head at night.

I once heard a gentleman express the novel idea that Catholics were incapable of being professionally successful. "Why is that?" I asked.


"Because your religion is opposed to it. It's a sin for you to do well," he told me frankly. I thought long and hard about this. Was I at odds with the idea of doing well, or did I think I would be in spiritual jeopardy if I became successful?

The truth is, religion has often swung the other way entirely, interpreting success as a sign that God was blessing you. Strains of Christianity present among us today still consider material wealth the "fruits" that suggest God is behind you all the way. They read poverty as a clear indication of moral failure as well. Is God for or against wealth, or doesn't heaven care either way?

or those who are unsure, the Catholic position in a nutshell is this: Poverty is not a virtue, nor is wealth inherently sinful. Success can obviously be measured in a lot of ways, but if it happens to include a nice fat paycheck, that's OK, too, as long as it is earned ethically. The real measure of our wealth, of course, is the treasure we've stored up in heaven, which makes whatever we have or don't have here ironically immaterial. The best kind of riches to bank on, according to scripture, is wisdom of the ways of God. If we've got that, our relative worth in dollars and cents won't impede our spiritual progress.

But here comes the rub: Without holy wisdom, money can well become the root of every evil. Because the plain truth is that posses-

Wealth proves to be a distraction, if not an obsession, which is why some have recently adopted the slogan of "downward mobility," simplifying their lives in order to have more time for the things they insist are their priorities. A lot of the saints led the way down this path, surrendering worldly wealth and position, even vanishing into cloisters to escape the bondage of possessions.

Passing through the needle's eve

he rich man who came to Jesus was obviously a good fellow. Jesus loved him, we are told, presumably because his yearning to do the right thing was so sincere. The man claims to

have kept all the laws since he was young (except the one about humility, we may imagine). So Jesus invites him to embrace a real challenge: translate his wealth into alms, divest, and join the disciples. This suggestion floors the man, who sadly turns away. In the end, he realizes he loves his possessions more than God.

This is the heart of the matter: It's the *love* of money that's the root of evil, and how can we not love money? It claims our hearts because of what it can do: liberate us from want, provide us with comfort and opportunity, secure our futures, take care of those we love. Money does a lot of good things, and it's good for us to have. But the difference between having money and being had by it is thin ice, treacherous to the spirit.

The way to test our attraction to money is the same way we test our love for people: Do we clutch them jealously to us, to serve our own agenda, or are we free to surrender them to God's purposes? If we attempt to possess our spouse, our children, or our friends, they, too, become our wealth. And the needle's eye will shrink around us as tightly as if we dragged bags of gold bullion behind us.

Then who can be saved?

The bottom line is: It's not what we have, it's how we have it that matters in the doorway of the Kingdom. Can we let our wealth go when it is required of us—and by wealth, I mean our stuff, our advantage, the esteem others have for us, our re-

lationships, our health, and even our lives? Is there anything we've got in our fists that's clutching us back so tightly that we are afraid to let it go? Following Jesus is a lifestyle that is only available to people who are truly free. If there's a prior claim on our hearts, we've still got some divesting to do.




