## Persistence, Convenient and Inconvenient

ome of the great cathedrals of the world took centuries to build. The architects who drew up the plans, the artists who contributed their craft, the patrons who put up the monev, and the workers who quarried the stone and laid the foundation knew they would never worship in the building they were helping to construct. Even their children and grandchildren would not enjoy the beauty of this sanctuary. Still, they hauled stone after stone and set it into place. They did it for the future, for a church that was yet to be imagined.

Raising children is an act of total dedication. For about 18 years it's an expensive, time-consuming, heart-rending, sometimes frantic, always vigilant occupation that comes with no guarantees whatsoever. There is no question that the lives of people without children are simpler, freer, more economically prosperous, and hold more possibilities for advancement in the professional world. Yet many people in every generation go on to have children anyway.

It is obvious from just these few examples that human beings are willing to labor and be grossly inconvenienced for purposes they consider worthy. There is more to life than personal gain, and happiness is not always had by putting yourself first. Sometimes, total dedication to someone or something beyond vourself is the most enriching and satisfying way to live. And so each generation persists in the pursuit of its dreams.

#### Persistence in Paul

he writer of the pastoral letter to Timothy urges the leaders of the community to proclaim the word despite all obstacles, just as elsewhere in Paul the faithful are enjoined to pray unceasingly. Is this realistic advice, and are these achievable goals? For saints and martyrs, yes; all others need not apply. It could be argued that, given the strictures and dangers faced by first-century Christians, saints and martyrs were the only kind of Christians in the game. Today this is no longer true, as "faith" has been defined down to imply mere church attendance. This could explain why the word is no longer preached when Convince, reprimand, it's decidedly inconvenient, and prayer takes place largely between 9 and noon on Sunday mornings.

In the biography of Paul, we learn just how darned inconvenient the proclamation of the word could be. The discomforts of the missionary trail, loneliness and misunderstanding, argument and accusation, rejection and arrest, beating and stoning, shipwreck and court trial and eventual beheading are all swept neatly under the term "inconveniences." During the Ephesus years, Paul may well have considered

the advantages of pastoring a pleasant little parish like this until retirement, enjoying the perks accorded a popular leader in a supportive community. But that would necessitate certain compromises in a message that was bound to upset the apple cart of powerful people sooner or later. Rather than water down the gospel, Paul got back on the road.

This brings us to the word *importunate*. It means troublemaker, and one who proclaims the word of God faithfully and well is most certainly that. Importunate is a word that became attached in church tradition to the widow Jesus told a parable about. The woman is a troublemaker, not because she wants something unreasonable, but because she insists on what is right. That spells trouble even in our world today.

id the widow use a carrot as well as a stick to get the judge to consent to her demands? Because the fellow is introduced as an unjust man, without fear of God or respect for human beings, chances are the only carrot that would appease him is a bribe, which the widow certainly wasn't about to produce. Her primary weapon in the war of attrition is the word: she irritates him with her refusal to give up and go away quietly, continuing to plead



her case until he is prepared to capitulate if only to end the discussion. He is not convinced; he simply raises the white flag. It is the method by which justice often comes into the world.

Jesus assures us that our persistence in prayer will have a greater effect than this, because we bring our claims for justice to One who is on the side of the just to begin with. We should not be afraid to become nuisances for the sake of the Kingdom, storming heaven with our cries for what is right. We cannot pray too many Rosaries or spend too many hours in contemplation. God will not become bored or annoyed with our persistence. If Paul is right, praying unceasingly is praying sufficiently. Anything less is not enough.
