

here were more important things in high school, to be sure, than receiving an award at the annual achievement ceremonies. Things like clear skin or getting the attention of that attractive student in the third row or up a sagging cumulative average. But I can't say the therefore, they can be foraward ceremony didn't matter, or that it didn't bother me tremendously when, three years running, my friend Patti got the English medal. English was my subject. Which is not to say Patti wasn't good; it's just that she was good at everything, and I was only good at this one subject. 
So I wasn't even paying attention at the end of my senior year, the night before graduation, when the awards were being given out. All of a sudden, I got the medal I'd waited for all those years. Someone on the faculty had finally recognized my genius!

Of course, the thrill of that hour didn't last long. It's almost 30 years since that medal came into my life, and I hadn't even remembered getting it until last week when my mother mailed it to me, the product of some archeological dig in the attic. The oncegold finish is now quite green, the ribbon is faded, and you can barely read the engraving. Public honor is a nice thing, but it turns to rust pretty quickly.

Sitting at the right and at the left

John were young men; given for asking one of the dumbest questions in the Bible. They wanted the glory seats, no more and no less. They wanted to be Jesus' right- and left-hand guys in the Kingdom coming! We understand the impulse: Those chairs were not yet occupied, and generally it's the squeaky wheel that gets the grease. Besides, who was better qualified to sit there? Peter, maybe, but he could only take up one seat at best. Matthew was a traitor tax collector, Simon a political revolutionary, and Judas a bit of a spook, the way he clutched the common purse. Andrew was left over from the Baptist's ministry, and the rest were fairly unremarkable. So why not one or two strapping young fellows like themselves?

They may have gotten the assessment of their companions right, but they got Jesus all wrong. They also mistook the coming Kingdom entirely, confusing it with some run-of-the-mill governor's mansion. They imagined Jesus sitting on a pleship, they were at least throne, passing his goblet of wine to his favored and loval allies. So when Jesus

ames and John are not ready to receive the acing a critical exam to pull he disciples James and Baptism that awaits Jesus in Jerusalem. They have no idea that the cup he will pass to them shortly will be filled with his blood. They are not prepared to embrace the hour of arrest and denunciation, scourging and humiliation, and the agony of the crucifixion to come. Nor are any of the other disciples, for that matter. None of these men will find the courage and conviction to stand with Jesus and drink from his cup. When the hour of glory arrives, they will scatter like sheep.

> Later, of course, things will be different for James and John. They had always been part of the early circle of three disciples who shared a privileged friendship with Jesus, and that intimacy would bear fruit. James would become one of the early martyrs of the church: his death is noted in Acts in 42 A.D. Though less is known of the later life of John, Paul notes in Galatians that Peter, James, and John remained "pillars" in the firstgeneration church. wide U-turn in their learning curve.

The Sons of Thunder see the light

saiah promised that the suffering servant would "see the light in fullness of days" for his willingness to surrender to the will of God made perfect, an event ness by being present to known by Jesus as the "hour of glory." This kind of glory isn't the variety sought by worldly folk, and it wasn't what Zebedee's sons had in mind. When Jesus talked about greatness in the Kingdom, he meant service ("being the slave of all") and ransom (paying the blood price for the life of another). It had nothing to do with honors and titles and chairs and cups.

But James and John were the Sons of Thunder, possibly earning this nickname because they called for the wrath of God to come down on the Samaritans who showed no hospitality to their group. They had to unlearn the idea that some are worthier than others, that worthiness is the goal for disciples to begin with. And we, who also forget that glory involves more than being covered with worldly esteem, may have to sacrifice a little of our thunder, too. Those medals of virtue and morality may look shiny to us at the moment, but getting on God's honor roll is not the point of followership.

Being baptized with Christ's Baptism

ome of us have gotten the Baptism of Jesus once, and we drink from his cup already. So is there more for us to ac-

complish? Yes: to participate in his suffering and death, which we will whether we mean to or not. These sacramental signs remind us we are baptized into a death that leads to life everlasting and that God transforms the suffering of the world into a saving act. All that's left is for us to give our faithful witthe world's suffering and dying (including our own), with compassion and without fear.




