

Jesus is calling you

Finding housing near a university is never easy, but enrolling in a degree program from out-of-state made it all the more challenging. So it seemed practical to accept a room in the on-campus graduate dorm rather than hit the ground looking for a place to live. However, when the young man arrived at school that fall, he found out right away that most grad students would prefer to live in the back of a pick-up truck before they'd choose a dormitory address. The folks sharing the dorm with him had extenuating reasons for being there: Either they were from out of the country and barely spoke the language, or they had disabilities that made close, accessible housing a top priority.

For the first time in his life as an able-bodied person, the young man lived in a world of wheelchairs, tapping canes, and guide dogs. His new friends had palsy, spinal bifida, and macular degeneration. During that time in the graduate dorm, he got a small taste of what a day in the life of Jesus might have been like: From every direction, people with every conceivable need showed up at his door on a regular basis. Could he come retrieve a fallen object or read a newly posted sign or assist a woman whose attendant failed to make it in to wash her hair?

"I learned not to take even the most mundane ability

for granted," the young man reflected in a letter to a friend. "I came to appreciate how much need there is in the world and how the smallest act of kindness can be a blessing."

Son of David, have pity on me

A day in the life of Jesus included teaching, preaching, healing, arguing, and a lot of walking. Leaving Jericho one day with a hoard of people trailing him (each hoping for more than he or she already had received), Jesus must have been at the weary end of the afternoon. And yet out on the road he heard a voice crying out, asking for mercy, while other voices shouted him down. "Call him," Jesus said simply.

So they told the man, "Jesus is calling you." That was enough for the blind son of Timaeus. He threw aside his cloak, possibly the garment he used to collect alms, and so discarded his old way of life. (In Mark, garments often suggest a change of attitude.) Bartimaeus is bold in approaching Jesus, calling him Son of David and Master, both affirmations of faith. Jesus rewards this shining example of courageous faith—so dramatically in contrast with the limp assent of his disciples—with the instant restoration of sight. (The last cure of a blind man in Chapter 8 was a more gradual process.)

What happens next may seem less extraordinary,

but it's the most remarkable aspect of the story. Bartimaeus becomes a disciple, choosing to follow Jesus "on the way." Scholars believe the wording suggests that Bartimaeus hangs in there all the way to the cross. His is the only example in the gospels of a cured person becoming a disciple.

Master, I want to see

Think of it: Of all the lepers Jesus touched, of all the blind who regained their sight, of the deaf and mute whose hearing and speech were restored, of the epileptics who were calmed and the deranged who became sensible, only one made the deliberate choice to turn and follow Jesus. The rest ran home in astonishment and joy, overwhelmed at the chance to take up their lives again with their loved ones in health and wholeness. We can't blame them for going back. The decision to go *forward*, into something entirely new and unknown and untried, is the peculiar choice. Bartimaeus must have been an unusual fellow to make it.

Mark tells his story as the climax to a series of healings in which faith has been a key ingredient. The disciples never seem to have enough of it, while those who are healed display faith in abundance. It is only natural, in the end, that one whose sight is restored would see his way into the ranks of the followers. Bartimaeus can no

longer envision a future that does not include Jesus. When this fellow said, "I want to see," he meant it!

This kind of sight is available to all of us, and necessary even for those who have never worn glasses to acquire. Our friend in the graduate dorm came to see the human predicament with new eyes from his privileged position in the community of those with disability. He saw that our world is full of need and limitation, and we only have to position ourselves in proximity to the want of another person to experience the call to respond to it, as Jesus did. We may not have a miracle up our sleeve, but kindness and compassion can heal what medical science cannot even touch. We should never doubt that we have been given the capacity to offer healing to others. The Holy Spirit assures us we can, and discipleship demands that we must.

Take courage, get up

We are called to offer the healing of Christ, and we pray for healing ourselves. These are not mutually exclusive tasks, as the "wounded healer" has been a model for ministry since Jesus on the cross. We cannot neglect our own growth toward wholeness, for we are all bent and blinded by the lives we've led and the circumstances of our world. What we've done and failed to do have left their mark on us, and compound that by generations and you have a working definition of original sin. Each of us needs healing in body, mind, and spirit: The church has sacra-

ments of forgiveness, anointing, and nourishment to encourage us. We have the community of faith to support us in seeing clearly; we may also need the support of counselors, 12-step programs, or medical professionals to maintain that clear-sightedness. And most of all, we need to make the deliberate choice to follow Jesus into the future, the choice that newly sighted Bartimaeus makes. Once we are finally able to see, we are invited to do.






