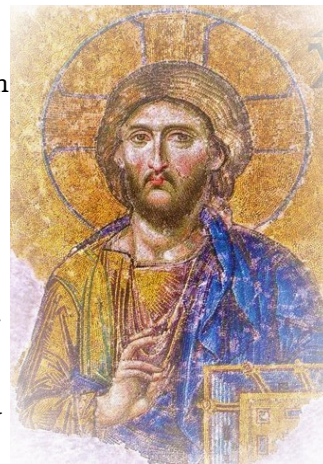
Welcome to all members and visitors who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist.

GROW: I think it can be easy to romanticize faith: the post-retreat high, the inspirational homily, even the motivational wall art that pops up on Pinterest. But *keeping* the faith can be hard sometimes. And living it out? Even harder. Today's readings both challenge and encourage us, as they so often do. The Letter of James pulls no punches: Faith without works is "dead." And in today's Gospel, right after Peter says, "You are the Christ," Jesus tempers that Good News, telling him that even the Son of Man must suffer greatly. We who follow Jesus must also be willing to take up our cross. This is a daily challenge to choose life over death; to choose the transformative power of Jesus over sin that creeps into our lives; to make the choice to put others' needs before our own. None of

this is easy. But as the prophet Isaiah reminds us, we don't have to do it alone; indeed, the Lord God is our help. We can choose well.



GO: I'm inspired when the young people in our parish assist with the Sunday liturgy and do service pro-

jects in the community. As a working parent (and back when I was a "stay-at-home" mom), I tell myself, maybe someday when things slow down, I'll do more. But honestly, I think the teens in the youth group – between work, school, and sports – are busier than I am. As we listen to today's readings, wherever we may be in life and faith, what stands out? Is it James' entreaty to pair faith with works? Or Jesus' words that "whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it"? Or the prophet Isaiah's rock-solid faith? Today's readings give us many ways to witness to our faith in Jesus – through prayer, service, generosity, perseverance, works, and words. We can ask the Holy Spirit to show us which of these gifts we can share with others this week.

ACTIONS: Brainstorm new ways to witness to your faith. It could be as simple as picking up extra food for the pantry in the back of church or changing up "Grace" at dinner to add prayers for others.

Be Renewed Starts THIS Weekend!

Perhaps over time, you (or Catholics you know and love) have lost a longing for the Mass. Does your Mass experience infuse in your heart with belief in the sovereignty of God, sustained faith, renew hope and guide decisions into the days ahead?

If not, it's time to refresh your memory about the blessings we encounter through the *real presence* of Christ in the Mass.

No meetings or classes are required. Our *Be Renewed - Eucharist Initiative* takes place during Masses on seven consecutive weekends starting with special themed homilies presented over three consecutive weeks:

- **(Sep 11-12)** "The Eucharist is a direct personal encounter with Jesus Christ"
- **(Sep 18-19)** "The Eucharist is the sacrificial memorial of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection by which we have been redeemed"
- **(Sep 25-26)** "The Eucharist is the sacred meal that nurtures us, bonds us together and sends us forth to transform the world"

These homilies will be available via online video so you can review and/or share. The links will be sent weekly via our Parish Life Flocknote.



- **(Oct 2-3)** The next homily will continue to break open the meaning of the Eucharist.
- **(Oct 9-10, 16-17 and 23-24)** Our last three weekends of "*Be Renewed*," will include brief explanations before each Mass about the meaning and history of various parts of the Mass and celebration of the Eucharist.

Don't miss these opportunities to renew your understanding of the Mass and awaken your longing for that which is the source and summit of our faith - the Eucharist. And please, invite any one you know who would like to learn about Catholic Eucharist!

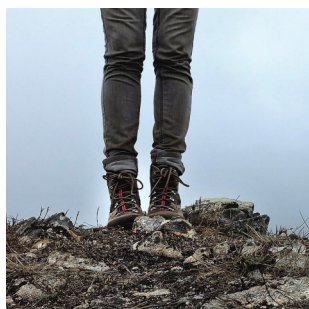
Can You Walk the Walk?

I've met and talked with enough people to feel confident that if you polled 100 fallen-away Catholics about why they didn't want anything to do with the Church, the term "accountability" would pop up in almost all of their answers.

And to be fair, a lack of accountability isn't just a Catholic problem. Talking the talk but not walking the walk has been a shortcoming handed down throughout the ages, across all creeds and nationalities.

Loving our neighbor, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, feeding the poor — it all sounds fantastic, especially when we're the ones saying it. But the doing — well, that's a

different story, isn't it? We would do well to remember that Christ calls one of his best friends "Satan" when Peter tries to convince Jesus to stray from his destiny.



Have you ever been called Satan by one of your good buddies? I'll bet it's not a great feeling. But think about what Peter was doing. He had just said, "You are the Christ." And now, mere moments

later, he's saying: "Don't say these things. Don't say you're going to suffer. Don't say you'll be killed."

He was telling Christ to squander what the Lord had given him. He was telling him that having faith was fine, but being faithful? It's just

a little too hard. God has a destiny for you, too, and He's asking you to be open to it. Maybe it's not in your comfort zone. Maybe you don't think you can do it.

Lord, give us faith — but help us, also, to do the work.
