Welcome to all who are joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist. There are many ways and parish organizations to participate in our life in Christ. See the directory on page 7.

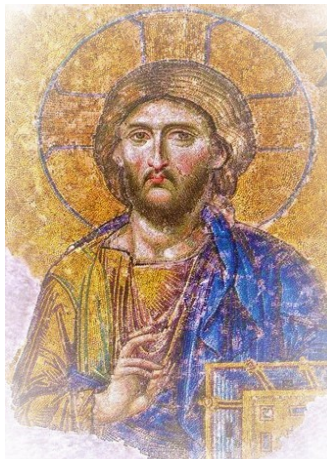

Don't Sit in that Chair!

I know people sometimes think that I make this stuff up. But life is so full of potential parables, as Jesus himself observed, that I don't have to. Once I arrived at a meeting at which lots of important church people were expected. Some of the attendees were well known in the diocese and a few around the country. Being the neurotic type, I arrived first and wandered the room in search of a good seat. I maneuvered around a large, fancy, overstuffed chair to get to the hidden observation site that is an introvert's paradise. The fancy chair itself was grandiose to the point of absurdity: all silk brocade, tassels, and mounds of fluff. But it sure looked inviting.

As each subsequent guest arrived, they all viewed the highly desirable overstuffed chair, clearly the best seat in the house. But each time it was considered and rejected, and a less conspicuous position was chosen instead. Most of the chairs in the room were your standard folding chairs, some with pads and some without. The padded chairs all went first, naturally, and soon all that was left were the cold metal seats and that huge, soft chair in the middle.

Most people avoided the fancy chair, I presume, either because they felt unworthy or anticipated some greater dignity than themselves to arrive and claim it. Finally, a woman no one knew strode into the room and, without a moment's hesitation, sank into that notable chair. At which point, sorry to say, the

whole thing collapsed beneath her.

I remember this incident every time the reading comes around again about not assuming seats of honor. In the reign of God, the one who claims the place of honor is itching for a sudden and humiliating demotion. The occupant of the fancy chair is going to end up on the floor, make no mistake.

My child, a little humility if you please

As a teacher, Ben Sira is paternalistic, and if he were my dad, I'd find him annoying. But he's right about the wisdom of showing a little humility. Not just *showing* it, of course. A fawning and obsequious personality is not what the virtue calls for. Nobody wants to see your best Uriah Heep imitation. But it's true that loud, demanding, presumptuous people develop a large and loyal cheering section—for their downfall. That's why some people are pleased when a celebrity like Martha Stewart stands trial and why some nations express *schadenfreude* (malicious satisfaction) when powerful nations like the United States experience misfortune. Everybody likes to see young David nail Goliath. Everybody, that is, except Goliath.

But is humility simply a political ploy, or a survival strategy? Ben Sira admits that the humble are beloved, but he adds that they also receive God's favor. Finally, he comes to the heart of the matter, at least within the wisdom tradition: Only

in the spirit of humility can one grow wise. The haughty, it would seem, believe too highly in their own opinions and experience to entertain a new perspective.

Settling into the lowest place

The church fathers and saints weighed in often about the subject of humility. Gregory of Sinai notes that there are two kinds of humility: the kind that perceives itself as lower than everyone else and the kind that ascribes all personal achievement to God. The first, he says, is only the beginning of the virtue, but the second is its consummation. Thomas Aquinas recommended humility as the most effective way to remove the main obstacle to our spiritual welfare: the preoccupation with earthly greatness. Ever practical, Teresa of Ávila regarded humility as simply being ready for what God desires us to do. This freedom from a personal agenda is tough on the ego, but gentle on the soul.

In these writings we gather that humility isn't just an attitude that God personally likes but a useful tool for making progress in the spiritual life. If you've got a garden, you wouldn't sneeze at the opportunity to use a hoe. If you're writing a computer document, it pays to hit the spellcheck even if you're a very good natural speller. In the same way, cultivating the practice of humility will save you a lot of time in the confessional line. The opposite of humility, it would seem, is eating more than your share of humble pie.

Jesus puts the matter plainly in two different stories. In the first, he points out that taking the lowest seat makes us eligible for a higher one, while taking the best seat puts us at risk of debasement. In the second story, Jesus recommends that we invite the lowliest people to enjoy our resources precisely because they cannot pay us back. This gives God the oppor-

tunity to reward us instead. Which is more preferable: a return dinner invitation to the lobster house or eternal satisfaction at the everlasting banquet?

Who wants to be humble?

Humility is a hard sell in this culture. Celebrity is chic, and obscurity is hell. People would rather be made fools of in front of Judge Judy than never be on TV at all. Reality shows have taught us something

really ugly about human nature: We are a race of shameless exhibitionists. How do we invite people to consider a way in which you actively choose not to be seen or celebrated?

It's important always to distinguish the virtue of humility from low self-esteem. Margaret Mary Alacoque stressed in her writings that it is just as important not to speak of yourself badly as to refrain from tooting your

own horn. Speak of God with praise and of your neighbor with respect—but do not speak of yourself well or ill or at all, she said. Maybe we could offer humility as a mode of ego hygiene: a spiritual cleaning of sorts. Try to go one day without talking about yourself. See how it feels. Learn what else there is to talk about.
