Dear Parishioners,

he letter on page 4 from Bishop McElroy addresses the scandal of the sexual abuse of minors in the Catholic Church. In his letter, our bishop asks for your prayers and invites you to attend one of eight town hall meetings he will be hosting throughout the diocese in October. The gathering for the El Cajon Deanery will take place here at OLG. Dates are being determined and will be announced in the coming weeks

Here at OLG, as a way for us to pray together for victims of abuse and for true reform of the Church in this regard, we will be "fasting" from the usual concluding hymn at all Masses and imploring the intercession of our Blessed Mother to lead us back to Jesus and keep our eyes and hearts focused on him lest we lose hope. Consequently, beginning with this weekend, all Masses through the end of the liturgical year will end with the singing of the seasonal Marian antiphon, Salve, Regina.

Speaking of music, I am pleased to announce the appointment of a new Director of Liturgical Music for our parish. After an extensive nation-wide search, Paul Thomas May has been hired to take the lead in our music program starting Sept 5. A bio for Paul is found below. I am grateful for the work and ministry of Colin Barkley. Concluding his position with us as Interim Director of Liturgical Music on Sept 7, Colin seamlessly stepped in where Br. Kevin McGoff, OFM, left off last December. Colin provided steady leadership in the music department for eight months and, for the foreseeable future, plans to continue as a cantor for our parish and section leader for our Gaudete Choir (Sun, 11:00 am).

onductor and baritone **Paul Thomas May** is a stalwart vocalist and devoted church musician native to San Diego. Mr. May served as the Director of Music for St. Rocco Parish, the first and oldest Italian Parish in Cleveland, OH, for the 2017-18 academic year, coordinating all liturgies and teaching music for the entire parish school. He is the former Director of Liturgical Music at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, San Diego, where he was responsible for Sat and Sun morning Masses directing the OLMC Liturgical Choir (50+ voices) and Schola (20 Voices). Mr. May previously held the position of Bass Choral Scholar and Assistant Director for the Choristers (children's choir) at St. Anne's Catholic

Church where he specialized in the performance and history of both Gregorian Chant and sacred renaissance/baroque polyphony. Though primarily a church musician, Mr. May is also the former director of the San Diego Mannskor, Norwegian Male Chorus, whose primary repertoire stems from the Northern European and Baltic regions. Additionally, he has worked closely with many other professional organizations in San Diego including the Bach Collegium San Diego, Folklore Music Guild, and San Diego Pro Arte Voices. His credentials include two degrees—Bachelor of Music and Master of Music-from San Diego State University in Professional Studies and Choral Conducting respectively. Mr. May is also the current director for the choir at Cuyamaca Community College.

Office of the Bishop

My brothers and sisters in Christ:

I am writing to the entire Catholic community of San Diego and Imperial Counties this week to speak about the unspeakable — the sexual abuse of minors by priests which was detailed in the report of the grand jury in Pennsylvania. The individual stories of abuse that robbed the souls and violated the bodies of so many innocent children and young people during the past seventy years are shattering. For me as a bishop there is an additional level of shame, because in many instances, this abuse was magnified by the leadership of the Church that placed fear of scandal and the culture of clericalism ahead of the protection of young people.

The Pennsylvania grand jury report demands action and also points the way toward reform in the life of our Church. That report reveals that the imposition of the zero tolerance policy in 2002 substantially worked. It ushered in a period in which sexual abuse of minors by priests fell dramatically through consistent reporting to civil authorities, the creation of lay boards to evaluate the truth of allegations, and the education of children about abuse.

The additional reforms that we must undertake at this moment must be based on the principles that produced positive change after 2002 — an unswerving focus on protecting minors and vulnerable adults and a binding voice for the laity in determining whether an allegation is true. Any genuine reform must forcefully integrate these principles in a framework of accountability that applies to bishops in their personal lives and administrative actions.

I have already begun a process of consultation with priestly and lay leadership in the diocese of San Diego focusing on the steps we need to take locally and nationally to accomplish genuine reform. During the month of October, I will hold eight town hall meetings throughout the diocese. These meetings will focus on seeking input from people in the pews on the pathway to such reform, listening to those who have been victimized by clerical sexual abuse either directly or in their families, and praying for God's grace to be our only guide. I invite you to be part of this effort by your presence or your prayers.






