

This Man Welcomes Sinners

ses talking God out of smiting the people of Israel off the face of the planet. At would the neighbors think what other point in history does a human being hold the moral high ground and teach God how to be compassionate? For a change, it's not we who are arguing for God to wipe out the bad people and God patiently insisting that frail humanity gets another chance to prove itself. Just this once, God has run out of mercy and is ready to show folks who's in charge. If not for the extraordinary forbearance of one particular person, we are given to understand, the base of Mount Sinai would have been washed in blood.

It's interesting to imagine the steep learning curve that brought Moses to this frame of mind. This is the same prince of Egypt who once murdered a taskmaster for beating a Hebrew slave. Moses hardly began this journey as a softhearted fellow willing to give lawbreakers a pass. Nor, the record assures us, is Moses generally a patient sort of guy. He loses his temper along the exodus route regularly enough to warrant correction himself. In fact, there is a point when Moses starts to show a bit of impatience with God, tapping the rock at Meribah twice to get the divine attention. Many believe this impertinence led to his being barred from the promised land in the end.

But a careful reading of this passage alerts us to the idea that Moses never

like the story about Mo- really makes a bid for God's ness is presumed, and dicompassion at all. He plays upon God's vanity—what if the chosen people were terminated? (see the deleted verse 12)-as well as appealing to God's own vows to uphold these people. It's God's word that Moses doesn't want to see compromised by a change of heart toward the descendants of Abraham. Mercy for sinners? The idea hadn't been invented yet.

Where mercy comes from

erhaps it's fairer to say that humanity was still too spiritually immature to comprehend the compassion of God. After all. God shows a remarkable tenderness to Adam and Eve in fashioning clothes for them once they learned shame. This same kindness is extended to Cain in protecting him with a special mark and repeated countless times in the Hebrew scriptures: to Elijah when his courage fails under the broom tree, to Jonah when he sulks under the shade of the gourd plant. While there are plenty "acts of God" visited upon sinners and attributed to God's wrath-flood, fire, famine, and pestilence, to name a few-God is understood at the same time to relent quite easily and show remarkable restraint for someone who has the power to crush opposition absolutely at a moment's notice.

How else can we appreciate the many psalms that cry to God for leniency? "Have mercy on me, O God, in



your goodness," today's prayer begins. God's goodvine compassion is at least a possibility the sinner can pursue.

Our appreciation of God as the source of abundant mercy comes to full flower in the revelation of Jesus Christ, naturally. After the example of Jesus' teaching, healing, suffering, dying, and ultimate forgiving, can we have any doubts that God's greatest desire for us is to reconcile us to heaven? And yet, sad to say, some Christians still clutch the punitive, angry, out-toget-us God to their breasts and prefer the idea of judgment to the hope of redemption.

Four stories of being found

🗋 aul of Tarsus was a blasphemer and a persecutor and arrogant, in his own words. Blasphemy was a sin against the second commandment, and persecution a crime somewhere between the fifth and the eighth. Paul's arrogance may well have broken the first commandment, because Paul put his idea of God up above the reality of the Lord he later encountered. Any way you look at it, Paul was in big, big trouble when it came to divine retribution.

But Paul tells us he was mercifully treated because of his ignorance. He seems to appeal to Saint Luke's understanding that God forgives sinners "because they know not what they do." Stumbling around in the moral blindness of a





sinful world, we do not reject the light so much as fail to recognize it. Once the light is revealed to us, however, we have to seize the opportunity to open our eyes and not turn aside again.

We may be lost in a sinful world, but God's mercy is out to find us. In the gospel parables, the sheep, the coin, and the son are by no means dispensable or overlooked because they are missing. God's mercy is not willing to cut losses or sacrifice a remnant in these parables. God wants 100 percent of our salvation and won't rest until we are given that chance. We are free to fail, it would seem, but not without a struggle will God lose us for good.

Being lost is not an uncommon experience, these stories tell us. Even the brother who never left home is in when folks "deserve" it. need of a search party. The father goes out to him because this older son is as ignorant of his father's

mercy as the one who expected to be received back as a hired hand. When it comes to apprehending the mystery of forgiveness, it seems, even the most righteous person (maybe especially the righteous one!) doesn't anticipate the breadth of it.

Celebrating mercy

he Eucharist is our premiere sacrament of forgiveness, as the church reminds us. But we have other ways of celebrating the compassion of God, the sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing being two of the most obvious. We also celebrate God's mercy in the exercise of it in our own relationships: being ready to forgive and willing to help whenever someone is in danger of being lost. We could use more advocates who, like Moses, cast their vote against judgment, even
