Thou Shalt Not Cheat

hen you think about it, there is no commandment specifically against cheating. We're not supposed to lie, steal, covet, or commit adultery; that is no guile." The children of much is spelled out. But cheating is not only not expressly forbidden, it is also more or less a biblical tradition. Recall Abraham and his classic line: "She's my sister." (This is not quite a lie, because they came from the same tribe and were kin in the oldworld sense. But it's definitely cheating.) It was deemed such a good ploy that his son Isaac borrows it later on in the story. Think of Jacob, thwarting his brother of his birthright. (What part of right didn't he understand?) Consider Laban, giving his nephew the same treatment on the ill-fated marriage night. Or Rachel, returning the cheat by taking her father's idols and sitting on them in her alleged uncleanness so that she could not be searched. How about Joseph, putting his silver cup in poor, unsuspecting Benjamin's bag and then arresting his brothers for stealing it? In the time of the patriarchs, cheating was practically the preferred way of doing business.

And it doesn't end there. Tamar gets the husband and son due her by law, not honestly but by tricking her father-in-law to lie with her. Ruth similarly helps herself to her relative Boaz's blankets in order to achieve what the law intends. Judith plays the grand defector and coquette when she really comes to assassinate Holofernes. No wonder Jesus would later say, "Imagine, an Israelite in whom there Israel had earned a reputation for being tricksters par excellence.

Not all cheating is created equal

D ut there were some D forms of cheating that were clearly beyond the pale. Abraham and Sarah tried to do a workaround with God's promise by using a concubine as a more viable way to gain heirs. God rejected this plan, but none of the participants are punished for their involvement. Onan, of course, took the opposite approach in trying to avoid raising up heirs for his brother. God rejects his plan, too, but does not spare the perpetrator. Saul cheats by consulting the witch of Endor, and this is just one of the many actions that contribute to his downfall. Kings cheat by honoring other gods on the side, and this is never tolerated. Priests cheat by eating the food offerings that are not part of their portion, and often this behavior leads to their demise. By the time of the prophet Amos, merchants have entered into the act, cheating for profit as a matter of course by setting their scales falsely. The habit of deceit has gotten way out of control, no longer in the service of life but as a mechanism for raw greed.

If the biblical record is any



indication, it's obvious that God isn't against cheating per se. As any child knows, it's entirely ethical to pretend there's no Jew in the closet during the Holocaust. God allows for pretense when the greater good is served. But when the motivation is mere selfishness, woe to those who play these dangerous games.

A difficult parable

he folks in the pews have a hard time taking Jesus seriously when he holds up the trickster steward as a role model. What exactly is there to admire about the guy? He has squandered his master's property in times past, and now he performs his coup de grace by rewriting the last of the receipts and "making friends with dishonest wealth" one more time. Oddly, even his master who has been cheated commends the servant for his prudence. This could be the key to interpreting this strange story.

The rich man is a "child of this world," as Jesus terms him, and holds worldly values above spiritual ones. If his steward had slithered humbly away, the master would have reviled him all the more. But instead the steward shows gumption, tactical smarts, and the spirit of self-preservation. A worldly master would appreciate those values and be half-tempted to give the guy his old job back, with a raise.

But what of the "children of light," pledged to practice another set of values?





They are far less consistent Acton famously said. He than the steward. Jesus says, trying to serve two masters when the material and spiritual goals are at odds with one another. This is the kind of cheating that marks us for death in biblical terms: pretending to be the servants of God while being besotted with money all the while. The answer, according to Jesus, is not to throw your money out the window but to put it at the service of spiritual goals. That way, you are cheating the devil, taking the worldly master and submitting him to the heavenly One.

Learning to cheat honestly

he pastoral advice that Timothy receives this week is technically unrelated to the other readings: He is urged to pray for kings and all in positions of authority. But we might forge a link here: Who is more tempted to cheat than those with the greatest opportunity? "Absolute

power corrupts absolutely," as the Catholic Lord wrote this in the 19th century (and was referring to the doctrine of papal infallibility when he wrote it). Acton spoke wisely about the temptations of power, and Timothy was well advised to pray for those who have it. So are the children of light behaving most responsibly when theywhich is to say, wesupport our leaders, both civil and religious, in prayer.

We must pray, but we must also lead by our example and our will stridently expressed. We are the richest country in the world, and we can either put our resources at the service of God or our own self-interest. If our money stays in our own pockets, then we're as good as cheating our sisters and brothers in need. And that's the sort of cheating to which God takes great exception.
